On November 5, 2010, Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (Enbridge) filed an application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and an application for a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 11 miles of 12-inch crude oil pipeline, to authorize construction of a new pumping station located near Kenaston, a new pump station near Lignite and station modifications at the existing Berthold Pump Station, all in Burke and Ward Counties, North Dakota, Case No. PU-10-612. The project is shown on the attached map. Enbridge also filed an application to waive and reduce procedures and time schedules required under North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 which require separate filings of applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit be consolidated into one application.

Public Hearings on the applications are scheduled to begin January 20, 2011 at 10 a.m. CST at the City Hall Auditorium, 5 3rd Ave NE, Kenmare, North Dakota, 58746. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

# January is National Radon Action Month, free test kits available

Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States, according to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Only smoking causes more deaths from lung cancer. To bring awareness to the dangers of high radon levels, the EPA has again designated January as National Radon Action Month. The winter months are the most accurate months for testing.

Testing in the home is the only way to know if radon levels are elevated. The Upper Missouri District Health Unit (UMDHU) is offering free radon test kits through the "Radon Awareness and Promotion Program." A postage paid envelope for return results is included. Radon is found naturally in soil and rock and gets into the air we breathe. Smoking, combined with high radon levels in the home, greatly increases the

risk of developing lung cancer. According to the North Dakota Department of Health, more than 60% of homes in ND have been found to have high levels of radon.

A limited number of kits are available on a first come, first serve basis. The kit is small, with a simple testing process that requires three days in the home for an accurate reading. A postage paid return envelope is included to return the test to the testing company, AirChek, Inc. As a follow-up, the homeowner will receive a letter stating the radon level in the home, and/or can check online for results.

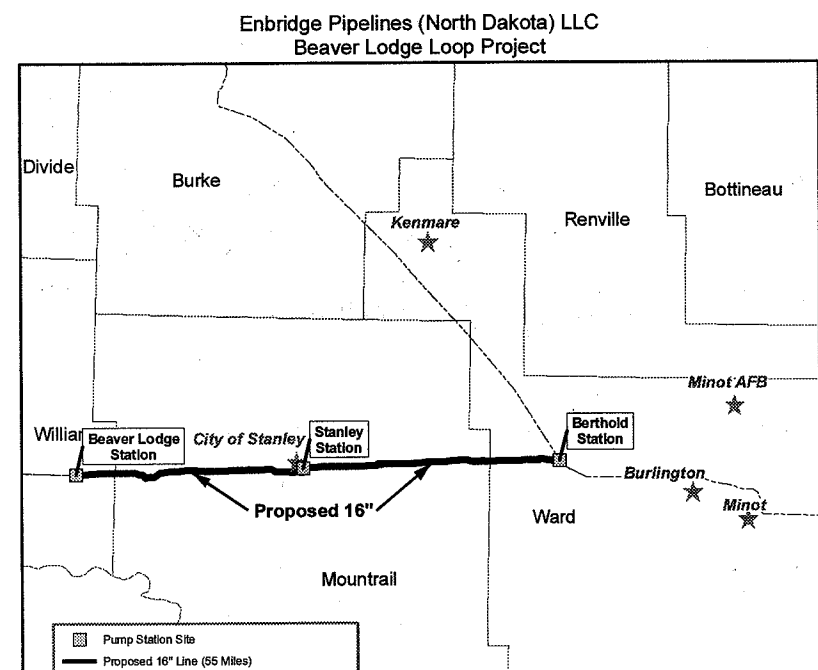
