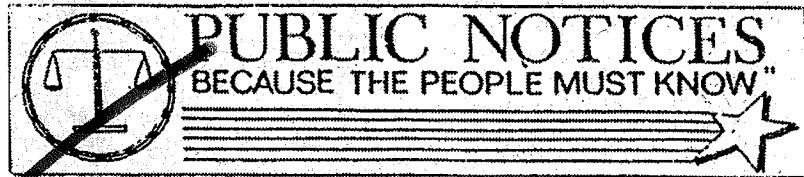

On November 5, 2010, Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (Enbridge) filed an application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and an application for a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 11 miles of 12-inch crude oil pipeline, to authorize construction of a new pumping station located near Kenaston, a new pump station near Lignite and station modifications at the existing Berthold Pump Station, all in Burke and Ward Counties, North Dakota, Case No. PU-10-612. The project is shown on the attached map. Enbridge also filed an application to waive and reduce procedures and time schedules required under North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 which require separate filings of applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit, require separate notices of such applications, require separate hearings on such applications and require certain time schedules and requested that the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit be consolidated into one application.

On November 17, 2010, Enbridge filed an application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and an application for a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 56 miles of 16-inch crude oil pipeline from its Beaver Lodge Station to its Berthold Station and to authorize construction of upgrades at its Beaver Lodge

Station, Stanley Station and Berthold Station, all in Williams, Mountrail, and Ward Counties, North Dakota, Case No. PU-10-613. The project is shown on the attached map. Enbridge also filed an application to waive and reduce procedures and time schedules required under North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 which require separate filings of applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit, require separate notices of such applications, require separate hearings on such applications and require certain time schedules and requested that the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit be consolidated into one application.

Public Hearings on the applications are scheduled to begin January 20, 2011 at 10 a.m. CST at the City Hall Auditorium, 53rd Ave NE, Kenmare, North Dakota, 58746. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
