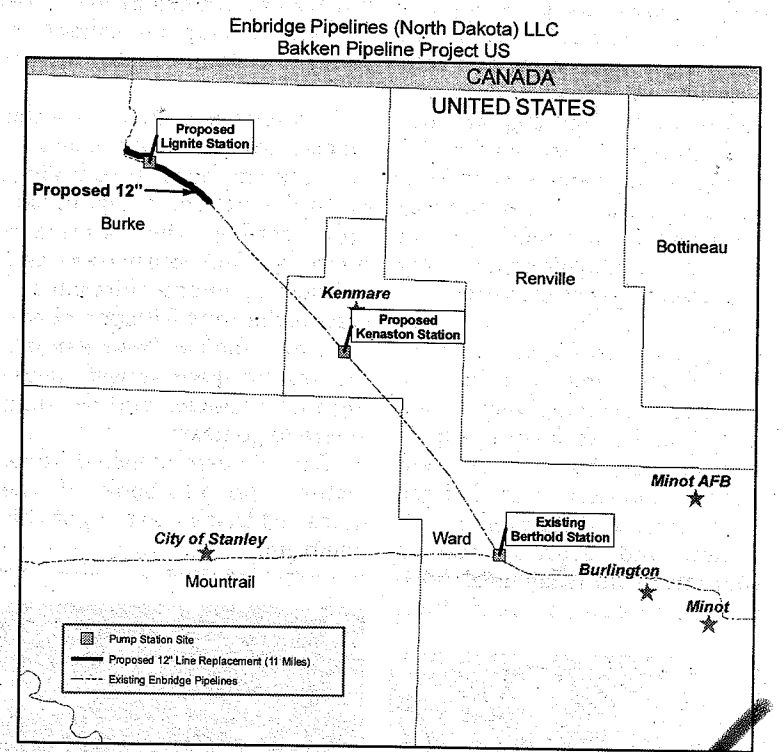
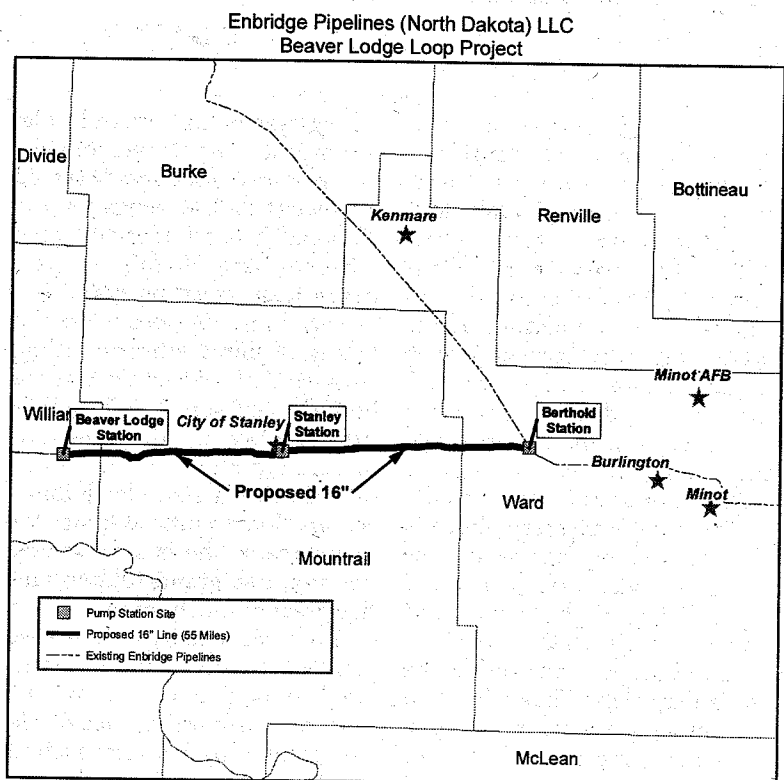
On November 5, 2010, Enbridge Pipelines (North Dakota) LLC (Enbridge) filed an application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and an application for a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 11 miles of 12-inch crude oil pipeline, to authorize construction of a new pumping station located near Kenaston, a new pump station near Lignite and station modifications at the existing Berthold Pump Station, all in Burke and Ward Counties, North Dakota, Case No. PU-10-612. The project is shown on the attached map. Enbridge also filed an application to waive and reduce procedures and time schedules required under North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 which require separate filings of applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit, require separate notices of such applications, require separate hearings on such applications and require certain time schedules and requested that the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit be consolidated into one application.

On November 17, 2010, Enbridge filed an application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and an application for a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 56 miles of 16-inch crude oil pipeline from its Beaver Lodge Station to its Berthold Station and to authorize construction of upgrades at its Beaver Lodge Station, Stanley Station and Berthold Station, all in Williams, Mountrail, and Ward Counties, North Dakota, Case No. PU-210-613. The project is shown on the attached map. Enbridge also filed an application to waive and reduce procedures and time schedules required under North Dakota Century Code chapter 49-22 which require separate filings of applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit, require separate notices of such applications, require separate hearings on such applications and require certain time schedules and requested that the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit be consolidated into one application.

## Board evaluates superintendent

The Parshall School Board met in special session Thursday afternoon to discuss the evaluation of Superintendent Steve Cascaden.

Board President Carol Zacher said she had taken the evaluations of all individual board members and put them together that was presented at the meeting.

Cascaden was evaluated in 37 specific areas related to the school and the community and received at least one unsatisfactory mark on 23 of the 37 areas. In four of the areas, working with the media, administering the budget, board and superintendent relationship and working well with groups, Cascaden received four unsatisfactory marks and one satisfactory.

Cascaden also received praise

members.

There were numerous other categories in which the superintendent received four out of five satisfactory marks as well.

"Because of the unsats, do we give him time to comply with this evaluation or deliver an unsatisfactory," Ramona Two Shields asked?

Zacher replied, "what would make it satisfactory?"

Cascaden, who said he would provide a written response to the evaluation, called some of the information one sided.

As an example, he said getting a year-end report ready is actually a task of the business manager, yet he was dinged on that area. He also received unsatisfactory marks in the Title I area but said that Title I is out of control and he accepts that.

"Maybe it's familiarity, maybe it's being in one place too long, but we've made great strides,"
