NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

On February 11, 2011, Rangeland Pipeline, LLC (Rangeland) filed applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit to authorize construction for approximately 20 miles of 8-inch crude oil pipeline in Williams County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. Rangeland also filed a request for waiver of procedures and time schedules established under North Dakota Century Code Chapter 49-22 and North Dakota Administrative Code Chapter 69-09-06. The Com-

mission finds the applications are complete.

A Public Hearing on the applications is scheduled to begin May 20, 2011 at 10 a.m. CDT, Tioga City Hall, 12 1st Street NE, Tioga, North Dakota, 58852. The issues to be considered are:

1. Is the proposed facility of such length, design, location, or purpose that it will produce minimal adverse effects, or, does a demonstrable emergency exist which requires immediate construction and that adherence to the procedures and time schedules would jeopardize the utility's system?

2. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

3. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental

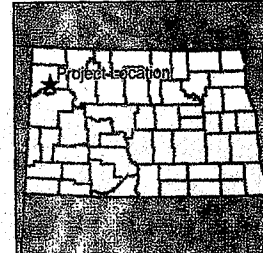
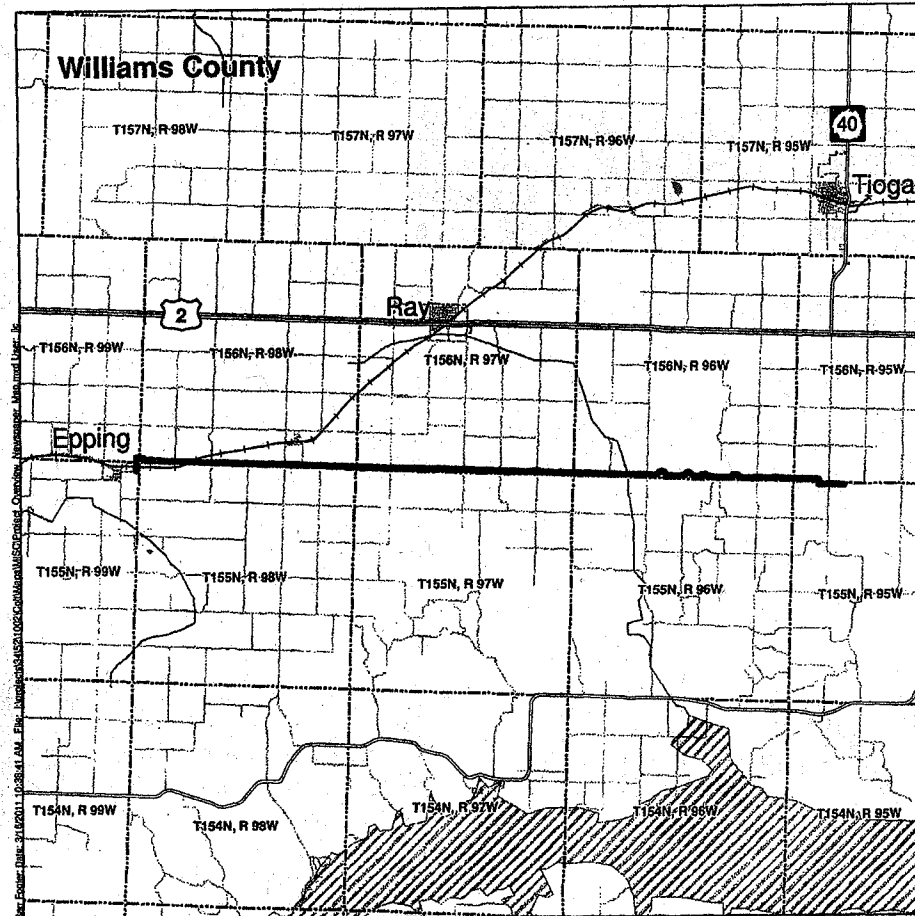
preservation and the efficient use of resources?

4. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

Land Sale Bids: Two bids were received for Lots 5 & 6 Block 3 Original Township to the City of Ray. Wane Engkjer bid \$2,500 for each lot, Paul Geatz bid \$5.00 for each lot. Eide moved, Viall seconded to accept the bid and approve the purchase of Lots 5 & 6 - Block 3 Original Township to Wane Engkjer. Motion carried unanimously.

John Rosa lot - Viall moved, Eide seconded to extend the start of construction for John Rosa for 60 days from today (May 28, 2011) at which time if the improvements to the lot have not been started, the lot will revert back to the city. Motion carried. Eide moved, Viall seconded to give Wane Engkjer first option to purchase the lots for the offered price of \$2,490 for each lot providing he will start building immediately. Motion carried unanimously. Steffan will notify Rosa of the decision.

Minutes - Viall moved, Eide seconded to approve the minutes from the March 14, 2011 meeting as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Auditor's Report

Steffan reported a certificate of compliance was received from the ND State Health Department for meeting the water requirements for small cities.

Steffan reported a business has not installed the plumbing to move the water meter and MXU to a dry accessible area so it can be read by radio read. Eide moved, Viall seconded to set a shut off date of April 15, 2011 if the meter connection has not been moved to a dry accessible area by that date. Motion carried unanimously.

Steffan presented the list of service agreements not yet returned to the city. Commissioners authorized Steffan to turn water services off if signed agreements are not received by April 15, 2011. Mayor Ranum instructed Steffan to send letters to inform them and also notify them if the service is disconnected, it will not be reconnected over a weekend.

Steffan presented a new policy from R&T Water.

Steffan reported she received requests for stop signs. As soon as weather permits, Steffan will check into installing signs and replace other signs in town in need of rehabilitation.

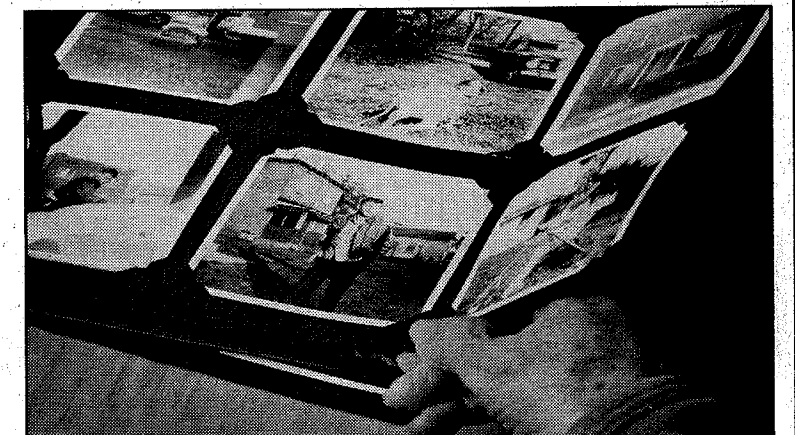
