ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS ROAD MAINTENANCE

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received for Road Maintenance, in Mountrail County, North Dakota. Bids will be received by the County Engineer, at the office of the Mountrail County Road & Bridge Department, 6160 Highway 8, PO Box 275, Stanley ND until 2:00 PM on February 2, 2012 and then at said office all bids properly submitted will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The bidding and contract documents may be obtained from the Mountrail County Road & Bridge Department, with payment of \$20.00 for each set of documents which is not refundable. The bidding and contract documents may also be examined at the office of the Mountrail County Road & Bridge Department.

The scope of work will consist of maintaining approximately 114 miles of township roads within Mountrail County with the use of a motor grader. Questions can be directed to Scott Stammen, County Road Superintendent, at (701) 628-2390.

Each bid will be submitted on the basis of a cash payment for work. It will be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the above mentioned County Engineer and shall be designated that the bid is for "Road Maintenance." The bid shall be accompanied by a Bidder's Bond in a separate envelope in the amount of five percent (5%) of the full amount of the bid, executed by the Bidder as Principal and by a Surety Company authorized to do business in North Dakota. If the Principal's bid is accepted by the County and the contract awarded, the principal, within ten (10) days after the Notice of Award, will be required to execute and affect a contract in accordance with the terms of the principal's bid and any requirements and conditions of the County.

A Contractor's Bond, as required by Chapter 48-02-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, shall be included with the executed Contract Documents. The Bid Security shall be as required in Section 48-01.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code.

All bidders must be licensed for the highest amount of their bids, as required by Section 43-07-05 of the North Dakota Century Code and a copy of the license or certificate of renewal thereof issued shall be enclosed in the required bid bond envelope.

No bid will be read or considered which does not fully comply with the above provisions as to Bond and Licenses, and any deficient bid submitted will be resealed and returned to the Bidder immediately.

The County retains the right to reject any or all of the bids submitted and to waive any informality in any bid and to hold all bids for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from said date of opening and to hold the three low bids and bid securities for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days from said date of bid opening.

The maintenance of the roadways is to commence upon April 15, 2012 and commence maintenance on October 15, 2012.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND ORDER AND NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

January 12, 2012

On September 29, 2011, the Commission issued an order in this proceeding issuing Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 123 and Route Permit No. 132 to Rangeland Pipeline, LLC ("Rangeland") for the construction of approximately 20.5 miles of 10-inch pipeline and a storage tank and meter station approximately 8 miles south of Tioga, for the transmission of crude oil, all in Williams County, North Dakota.

On December 20, 2011, Rangeland filed a motion for an amendment to remove from the Order the finding that a cultural resource site is located within the Beaver Lodge Meter Station Site and the requirement that Rangeland fence out a portion of the Beaver Lodge Meter Station to protect the cultural resource site. Finding of Fact paragraph 16.

On October 26, 2011, Rangeland conducted a second Class III Cultural Resource Inventory of the Beaver Lodge Meter Station and determined that no cultural resources were present. On November 25, 2011 the North Dakota State Historic Preservation Office concurred with the determination of "No Historic Properties Affected" and "No Significant Sites."

The issues to be considered in this proceeding are:

- 1. Whether Finding of Fact paragraph 16 should be removed from the December 20, 2011 Order; 2. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota? 3. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources? 4. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearings must be received by February 14, 2012. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.
