
On February 17, 2011, Bear Paw Energy, LLC filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction and operation of two 100 million cubic feet per day natural gas processing plants to be located in Williams County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. The Commission finds the application is complete.

A **Public Hearing** on the application is scheduled to begin **April 25, 2011 at 11 a.m. CDT, City Hall, 22 E Broadway, Williston, North Dakota, 58801**. The issues to be considered are:


1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

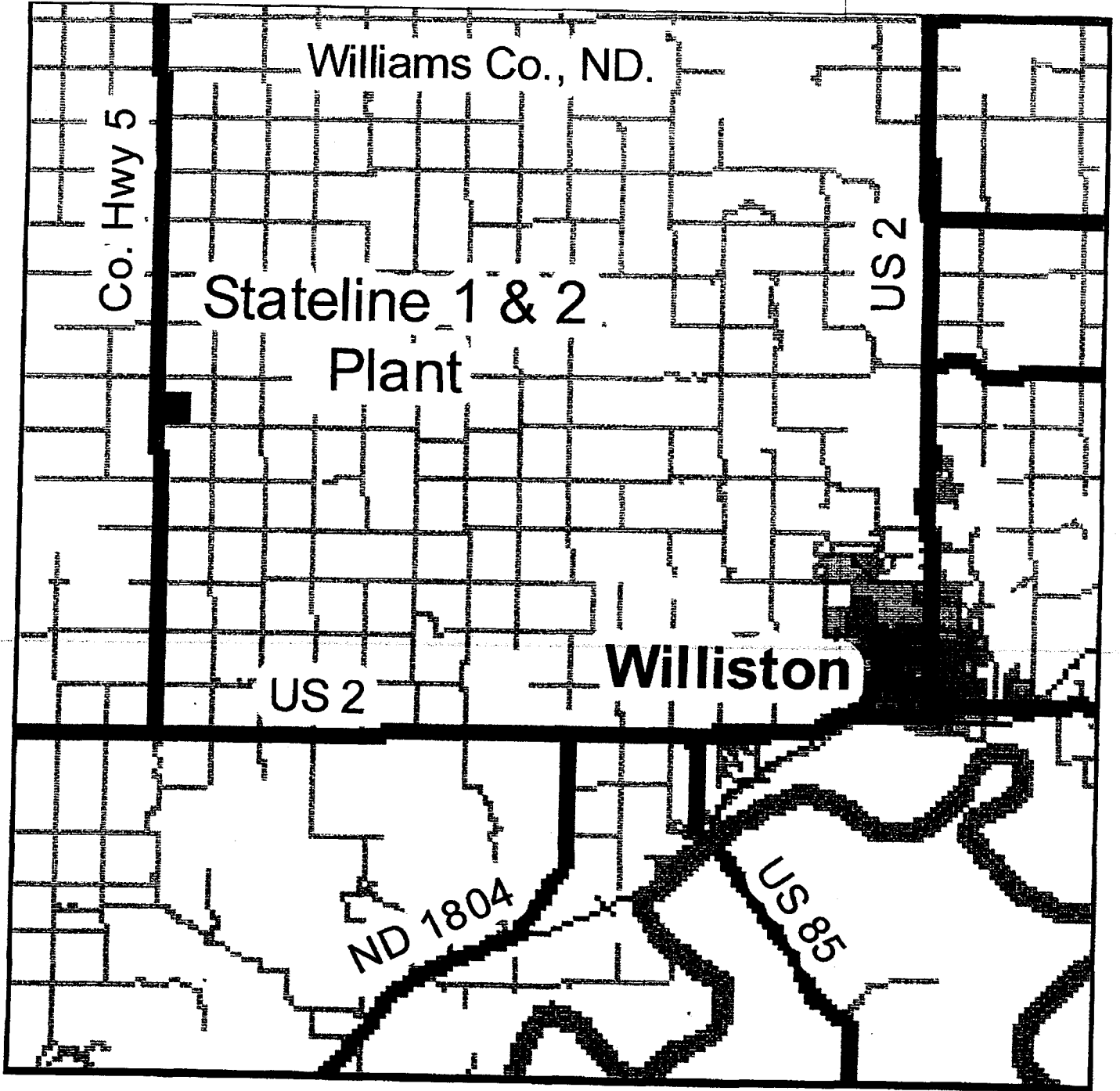
