The undersigned, David Schmunk, being the Chief Operating Officer of Vantage Pipeline US LP (“Vantage”), having the authority to act on behalf of and bind Vantage, does hereby certify under oath:

1. That pursuant to Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order, dated June 20, 2012, the Public Service Commission granted to Vantage Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 137, and Route Permit Certificate No. 148 for the construction of approximately 79.80 miles of 10-inch pipeline in Williams and Divide Counties, North Dakota, for the transportation of natural gas liquids.
2. That construction on the pipeline has been completed.
3. That Vantage determined that during construction a minor adjustment to the approved route was necessary. Attached is an exhibit depicting the minor route change.
4. Also attached is a letter dated May 21, 2014, from an environmental consulting firm indicating that the reroute, for the length of only 98 feet, had to be constructed slightly outside of the approved corridor in order to fully avoid a known cultural resource site.

5. That construction activities did not affect any known exclusion or avoidance area.
6. That the owner of the real property on which the adjustment is located and any applicable government entity with an interest in the adjustment area did not oppose the adjustment.
7. That Vantage will comply with the Commission's Order, laws, and rules designating the corridor and designating the route.

Dear Mr. Nitschke:

Enclosed for filing by Vantage Pipeline US LP is a route modification shown on the attached map. This reroute caused the as-built route to be slightly outside the PSC approved 300 foot corridor. The reroute was the result of maintaining the 45 feet buffer around a cultural resource that was discovered during the Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) investigation. The reroute area was flagged as an area of concern and was subjected to an additional survey to ensure all environmental and cultural resources were inventoried prior to the pipeline construction. This reroute does not cross parcel boundaries, remains on privately owned native grassland, and does not impact wetlands or government assets.

The total pipeline length that exists outside the approved corridor is 98 feet with a maximum distance from the boundary of 9 feet. Please reference the attached map for more details.

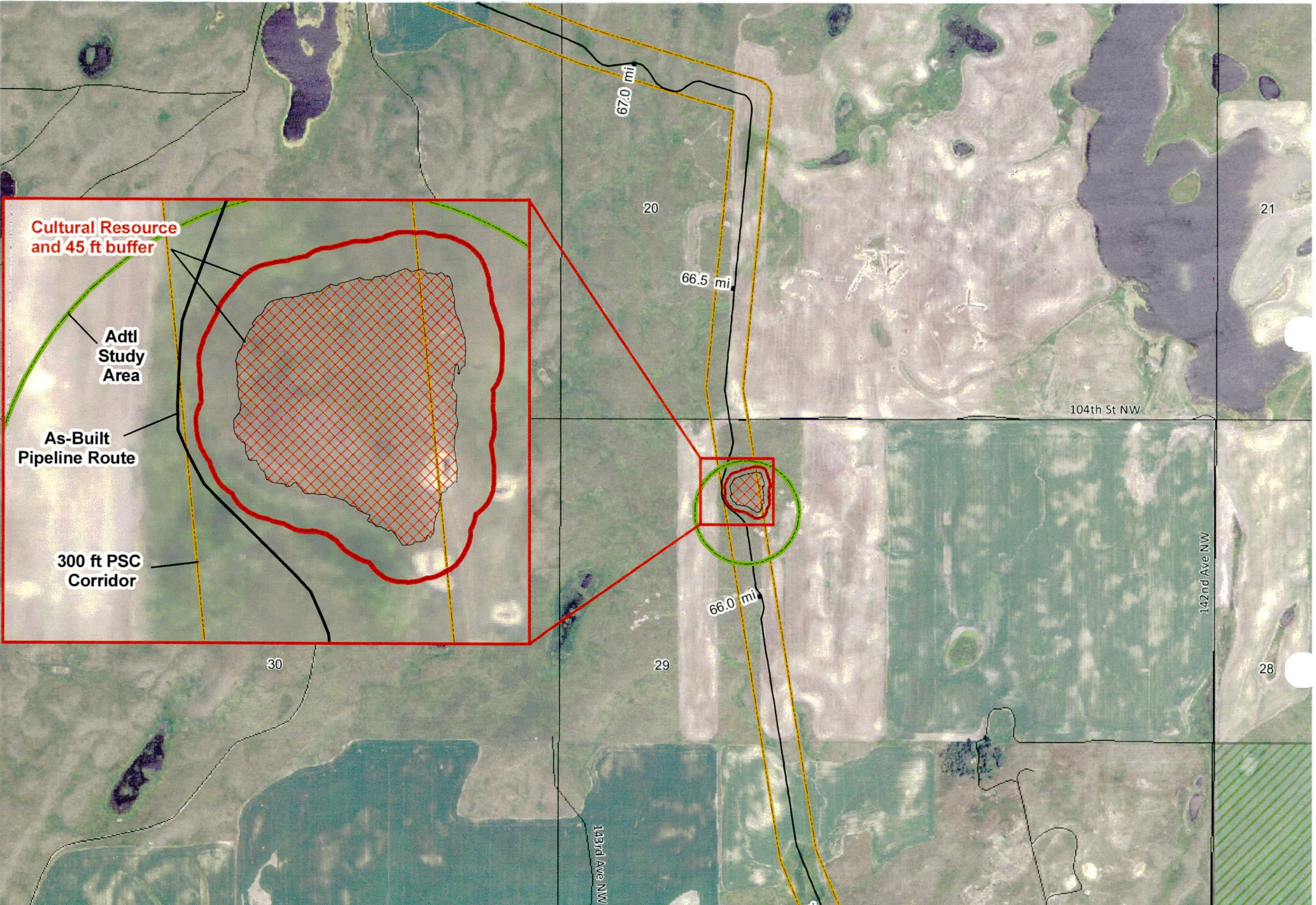

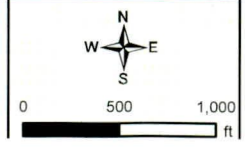
