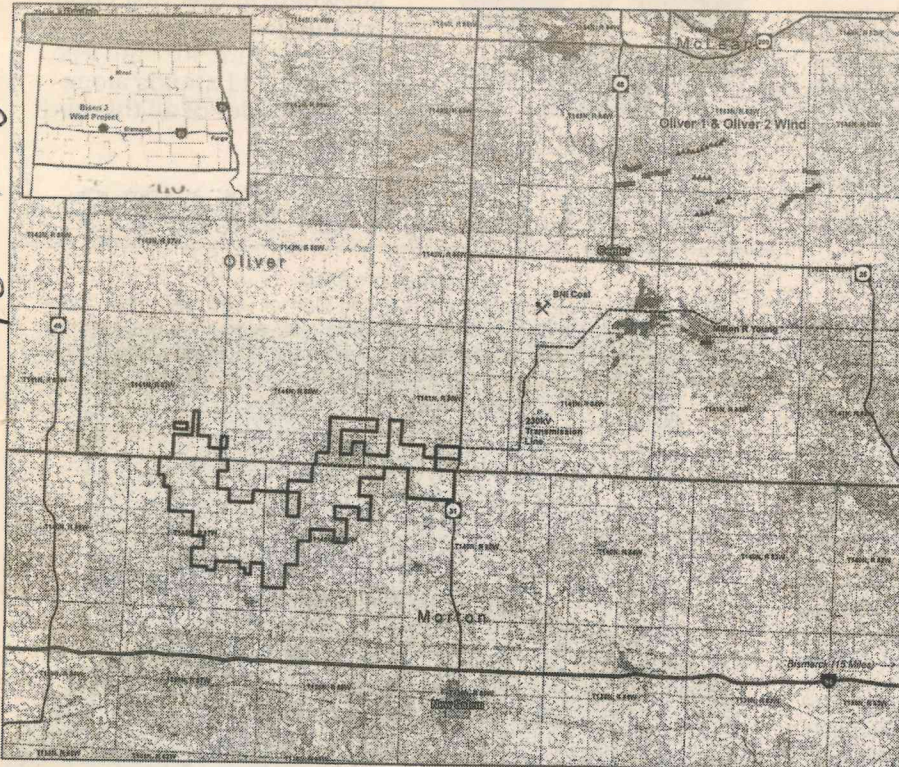

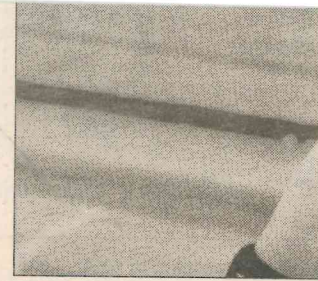
On July 7, 2011, Minnesota Power, an operating division of ALLETE, Inc., (Allete) filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of a 105 MW Bison 3 Wind Project consisting of 35 wind turbine generators and associated facilities in Morton and Oliver Counties, North

Dakota, as shown on the attached map. A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin September 15, 2011, at 10:00 a.m. CDT, at the Oliver County Courthouse, 11 West Main, Center, North Dakota 58530. The issues to be considered are:
 1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
 2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
 3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continu-

ing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
