

years if a farmer wishes to qualify. The states of Iowa, Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota and South Dakota are covered by the change. All other policy provisions must also be met.

"The requirement to be able to bring an insured crop to harvest in one of four years improves program integrity," said Administrator Murphy. "It also helps to meet the needs of farmers in the Prairie Pothole region, where some acreage

with fall (winter and spring wheat coverage) sales closing dates.

Prevented planting coverage due to floods, hurricanes, or excess rain during the insurance period that prevents other producers from planting acreage with similar characteristics, is provided for most crops. Because conditions vary significantly between geographic areas, loss determinations are based on each producer's circumstances. Producers must contact their crop
