Moment for Reflection

Living in a mixed up world

"... every man did that which was right in his own eyes" (Judges 17:6b). This sentence describes a very dark time in the history of the nation of Israel. God's own chosen people had, as a nation, rejected Him. God had warned them that the tendency would be to forsake His law when times were good, and they needed to beware of that danger. Sadly, they forsook the rule of God and each person became a law to themselves. The result was disastrous! Instead of reaping the blessings of God, the people began to reap the harvest of sin. Spiritual confusion, moral wickedness and physical bondage became the norm. Psalm 119:130 tells us that "the entrance of [God's] Word giveth light." The opposite is also true: rejection of God's Word brings darkness.

This period of Israel's history is not unlike our

and His law. Human life is dispensable. Marriage is optional. Creation by an all-powerful God is said to be a myth, etc. How is a person to live a successful Christian life in a culture such as our own? First, you must **know the Truth**. Jesus said that the truth would make us free (John 8:32). The only way to know the truth is to study God's Word. Second, you must **apply the Truth** to your life. The Bible states that those who know the truth but don't practice it are deceiving themselves (James 1:22). Thirdly, **don't be afraid to be different!** If you are actively living God's Truth, you will be counter-cultural. Jesus Christ did not fit into His culture, either. But He brought freedom and light, and it is only by following Him that we will be able to live successfully in a mixed up world!
