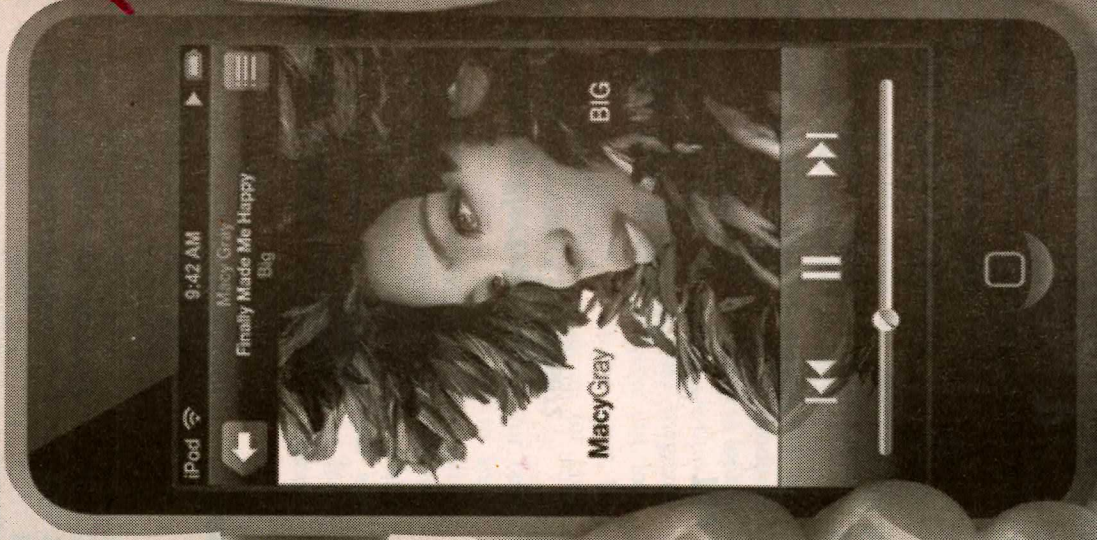

HEARING

On December 29, 2011, Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail) filed a request for approval of its 2012 Renewable Resource Cost Recovery Adjustment Factor (Factor) for recovering costs associated with its wind farms. The proposed Factor includes updated cost and revenue information for investments in the Langdon, Ashtabula, and Luverne Wind Projects. The proposal would add \$0.00005 per kWh for an increase of 4¢ per month for a typical residential customer using 750 kWh. The issue to be considered is what Factor is necessary to provide a just and reasonable rate of return on Otter Tail's commission approved investment in wind farms for the service and convenience of the public in North Dakota?

Petitions to intervene must be received by March 7, 2012. Comments and requests for a hearing must be received by March 15, 2012. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. If deemed appropriate, the commission can determine these matters without a hearing.
