What you should know about Niacin

What is Niacin?

Niacin, also known as nicotinic acid, is a form of vitamin B3 used to improve HDL "good" cholesterol and lower triglycerides and LDL "bad" cholesterol. It is also used to treat niacin deficiency.

What types of niacin are available?

There are four different types of niacin used to improve cholesterol: immediate-release, extended release, long-acting (also referred to as sustained-release, controlled-release, or timed-release), and no-flush niacin. Immediate-release products are available over-the-
