Minutes of the Board of Ward County Commissioners May 22, 2012 The special building space needs meeting of the Ward County Commission was called to order by Chairman Fieldahl at 9:00 a.m. with Comm. Erickson and Nybakken present. Also present were States Attorney Fozza Larson, Myron Knutson, and Auditor/Treasurer Devra Smested. Citizens Committee members also present were: David Kopp, Orin Backes, Bruce Walker, Molla Romme, and Al Hanson. Comm. Nybakken stated that the meeting was canceled and is to be rescheduled prior to the next building space needs meeting. Architect Don Davison updated the Committee on the new concerns for each of the partners in the partnership. Most of the immediate changes to the newly proposed plans. The Ward County Social Service office is concerned about not having enough space. They also let Davison know that there are two different departments and could be split onto two separate floors. The State's Attorney office is concerned about not having the recorder's office also has some concerns about needing more space in the future. Davison reported that there is no new information about the MDU Substation. Myron Knutson presented information regarding the Committee of options for financing. Comm. Gruenberg joined the meeting at 9:17 a.m. Knutson presented information about general obligation bonds, lease revenue bonds, and leaseback.
