REGULAR SESSION Monday, June 11, 2012

The Portland City Council met in regular session on Monday June 11, 2012 in the Memorial Hall Building. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mickels. Also present were Aldermen Ed Lenaburg, Shirley Rux, Ryan Domier and Josh Braaten. Minutes for the May 14, 2012 regular meeting were presented. Motion Braaten, second Rux to approve minutes as amended, all aye, motion carried.

Deputy Sheriff Tvedt was in attendance to discuss any concerns expressed by the City of Portland. Mail reviewed. Council reviewed the status of the "Welcome to Portland" signs that should be installed this week. Water quality report for 2011 was accepted by the North Dakota Department of Health. North Dakota Workforce Safety & Insurance will be conducting a premium audit on Wednesday June 13, 2012. Xcel energy will be performing necessary upgrades to the electrical system and will involve a power outage on Wednesday June 13, 2012 between the hours of 3am and 5am. Notifications will be posted in the Post Office and Senior Center. Possible property tax sale to occur in October reviewed. The council will contact scrap metal vendors to get information regarding the removal of unlicensed and abandoned vehicles from within the city limits. Building permit requested for a
