The sources of drinking water... (both tap and bottled water) include... rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reser... voirs, springs and wells. As water... travels over the surface of the land... or through the ground, it dissolves... naturally-occurring minerals and... in some cases, radioactive material... and can pick up substances result... ing from the presence of animals or... from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present... in source water include:

Microbial contaminants, such as vi... ruses and bacteria, which may come... from sewage treatment plants, sep... tic systems, agricultural livestock

the Food and Drug Administration... (FDA) regulations establish limits... for contaminants in bottled water... which must provide the same pro... tection for public health.

Not Applicable- (N/A)
Parts per million (ppm) or Milli... grams per liter (mg/l) - one part... per million corresponds to one minute... in two years or a single penny in... \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micro... grams per liter (ug/l)- one part... per billion corresponds to one minute... in 2,000 years, or a single penny in... \$10,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/l) - pico... curies per liter is a measure of the... radioactivity in water.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit... (NTU) - nephelometric turbidity... unit is a measure of the clarity of... water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU... is just noticeable to the average per... son.

Action Level (AL)- The concentra... tion of a contaminant which, if exce... ded, triggers treatment or other... requirements which a water system... must follow.

Treatment Technique (TT) - A trea... tment technique is a required proc... ess intended to reduce the level of... a contaminant in drinking water.

Maximum Contaminant Level - The... "Maximum Allowed" (MCL) is the... highest level of a contaminant that... is allowed in drinking water. MCLs... are set as close to the MCLGs as... feasible using the best available... treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal... - The "Goal" (MCLG) is the level... of a contaminant in drinking water... below which there is no known or... expected risk to health. MCLGs allow... for a margin of safety.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant... Level (MRDL) - The highest level... of a disinfectant allowed in drink... ing water. There is convincing evi... dence that addition of a disinfectant... is necessary for control of microbial... contaminants.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant... Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level... of a drinking water disinfectant... below which there is no known or... expected risk to health. MRDLGs do... not reflect the benefits of the use... of disinfectants to control microbial... contaminants.

EPA requires monitoring of over... 80 drinking water contaminants. Those... contaminants listed in the tables... above are the only contaminants... detected in your drinking water.

Inadequately treated water may... contain disease-causing organisms. These... organisms include bacteria, viruses... and parasites, which can cause... symptoms, such as, nausea, cramps... , diarrhea and associated headaches.

Unregulated contaminants are... those for which the EPA has not... established drinking water standards. The... purpose of unregulated contaminant... monitoring is to assist the EPA in... determining the occurrence of un... regulated contaminants in drinking... water and whether future regulation... is warranted.

Drinking water, including bottled... water, may reasonably be expected... to contain at least small amounts... of some contaminants. The presence... of contaminants does not necessarily... indicate that the water poses a... health risk. More information about... contaminants and potential health... effects can be obtained by calling... the Environmental Protection Agency's... Safe Drinking Water Hotline (1-800-426-4791).

MCL's are set at very stringent... levels. To understand the possible... health effects described for many... regulated contaminants, a person... would have to drink 2 liters of... water every day at the MCL level... for a lifetime to have a one-in-a... million chance of having the... described health effect.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons, such as, persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system dis-

orders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (1-800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead... can cause serious health problems, especially... for pregnant woman and young children. Lead... in drinking water is primarily from... materials and components associated... with service lines and home plumbing. City... of Langdon is responsible for providing... high quality drinking water, but cannot... control the variety of materials used... in plumbing components. **Use water from the cold tap for drinking and cooking. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking.** If you are concerned about lead in your drinking water, you may wish to have your water tested.
