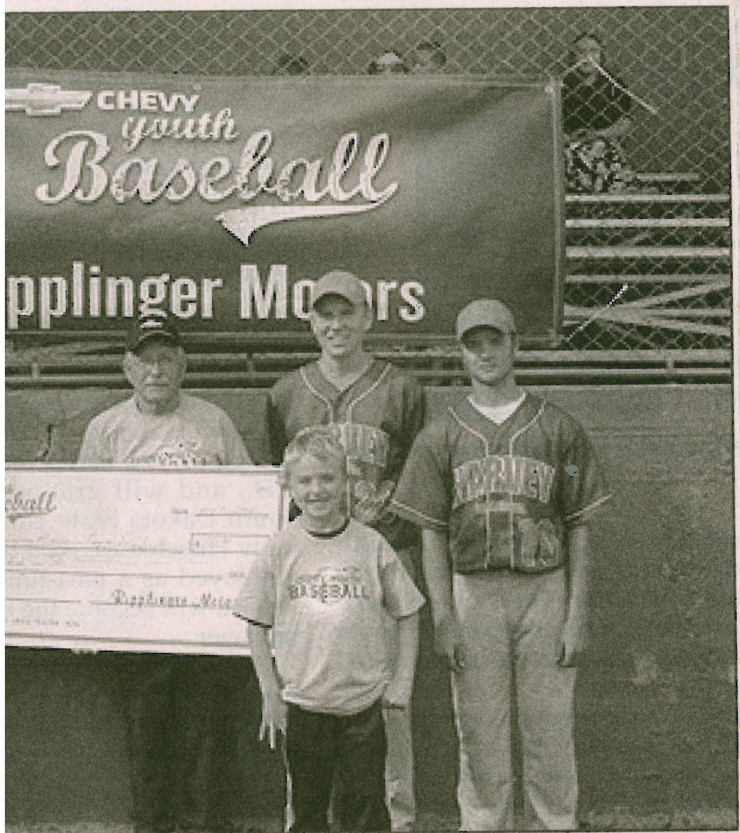

## Fessenden City Council Minutes

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE FESSENDEN CITY COUNCIL Non-Approved Regular Session Tuesday, June 5, 2012 - 7:00 P.M.**

The Fessenden City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, June 5, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. with President Tim Beck presiding. Aldermen present were Feakes, Helm and Middleman. Also present were Police Chief Hoffer, Water Commissioner Keller, Andrew Aarke of Moore Engineering, Travis Peterson of Peterson Law Office and Julie Knodel.

It was moved by Middleman, seconded by Feakes, to approve and dispense with the reading of the minutes from the previous meeting. Motion passed.

It was moved by Helm, seconded by Feakes, to approve and pay the bills from the city treasury. On roll voice vote there were 4 ayes and 0 nays. Motion passed.

It was moved by Feakes, seconded by Helm, to approve and file the following reports, the Police Report, the Water Report and the Treasurer's Report. Motion passed.

Julie Knodel was in attendance to address a property concern in her neighborhood. The nuisance ordinance was reviewed.

Andrew Aarke of Moore Engineering and Travis Peterson of Peterson Law Office were in attendance to discuss establishing a Home Rule Charter and any pros and cons that would result in doing so. If the city wants to pursue city sales tax, it would first need to become a Home Rule Charter. Peterson reviewed the process of adopting Home Rule Charter with the council. This process takes time and is determined by vote of the citizens. If this is to be included on the November Ballot, the council would need to make a decision by the July 2, 2012 council meeting.

Keller reported the pump at the lift station is kicking out again, shingle disposal has been going well at the city dump, and he hopes to fog for mosquitoes prior to the fair. The City asks that all residents respect the tree ordinance

and trim all trees on the Boulevard to the height of 12 feet above the street. Hoffer reported the vet clinic and dog licensing is scheduled for July 23, 2012.

It was moved by Middleman, seconded by Feakes, to purchase used fire sirens from the City of New Rockford. Motion passed. This will allow better siren coverage throughout the city.

Aldermen questioned whether the city should look into establishing an ordinance prohibiting man-camps in the city limits. There have been reports of skunks in or near town. The city asks that residents do not leave dog or cat food outside that could attract skunks. June 12, 2012 is the Fessenden City Wide Rummage Sale. Civic and Commerce has asked the city to provide cones to block off Main Street for the vendors.

With Attorney Peterson in attendance, council took this opportunity to talk about abandoned/dangerous properties in the city and the best procedure to clean up these properties. It was moved by Feakes, seconded by Middleman to approve City Attorney Travis Peterson to research the city ordinances to determine what procedure is required to move forward with dealing with dangerous properties throughout the city. Motion passed.

Auditor stated Workforce Safety conducted an audit May 23, 2012. The independent audit from Rath & Meyer will be June 11, 2012. Reorganizational Meeting will be Tuesday, June 26, 2012, at 7:00 p.m.
