 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: That the County Water Resource Board for Pembina County, North Dakota, will receive bids for the reconstruction of Drain No. 8 in northeastern Pembina County, North Dakota, which construction is located approximately 5 miles southeast of Neche, North Dakota. Bids will be accepted at the Pembina County Water Resource Board office located at 308 Courthouse Drive #5, in the City of Cavalier, North Dakota, until 10:30 o'clock AM, Tuesday June 26th, 2012. At that time qualified bids will be opened and read aloud in the Pembina County Water Resource Board room.
 Plans, Drawings and Specifications for the project may be seen and examined at the Office of the Pembina County Water Resource Board, Cavalier, North Dakota, during office hours of Monday through Friday any person may purchase a set of bidding documents upon a deposit of \$75.00 for each set of plans, none of which will be refundable.
 Each bid is to be submitted on the basis of cash payment and to be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the Pembina County Water Resource Board. Each bid shall be accompanied by a Bidder's Bond in the sum equal to five (5) percent of the full amount of the bid, executed by the bidder as principal and by a surety company authorized to do business in this State, conditioned that if the principal bid is accepted and the Contract awarded to him, he/she within ten (10) days after notice of award, will execute and effect a contract in accordance with the terms of his bid and also a contractor's bond as required by law and the regulations of the Pembina County Water Resource Board.
 The bidder's bond shall be enclosed in a separate sealed envelope together with a copy of the license, or certificate of renewal thereof, issued by the Secretary of State to the bidder. The envelope containing the bid shall be designated "Bid for Reconstruction of Drain No. 8" upon the outside thereof. The bidders bond and a copy of the contractor's license shall be in a separate envelope attached to the envelope containing the actual bid. The envelope containing the bidders bond and contractor's license shall identify the name of the contractor on the outside along with "Bid Bond".
 All Contractors bidding must be holders of a license in the class within which the value of the project as herein estimated shall fall. A bidding contractor must be holder of a license qualified for the project for a period of at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for receiving bids, and be eligible to enter into a contract with a governmental agency.
 No bid will be read or considered which does not fully comply with the above provisions as to bonds and licenses, and any deficient bid submitted will be resealed and returned to the bidder immediately. If a "Bidder's Bond" and a copy of the "Contractor's License" is not enclosed in the separate envelope accompanying the Contractor's Bid, the Contractor's Bid will be returned to the contractor unopened.  Work consists of approximately 38,485 cubic yards of common excavation, installation of 376' of 60" Dia. CMP, installation of 264' of 24" Dia. CMP, 6 water control gates, 70 cubic yards of riprap, suitable fill for around culverts if needed, and seeding/mulching of approximately 15 acres.
