## NBA FINALS MATCHUPS

A position-by-position look at the series between the Oklahoma City Thunder and Miami Heat:

**center**

Kendrick Perkins vs. Udonis Haslem. Perkins brings the NBA finals experience most of his young teammates lack, having been part of Boston teams in 2008 and '10. He had a rare high-scoring night in Oklahoma City's regular-season win over Miami, scoring 16 points on 8-of-11 shooting, is time on the court in this series could depend on the Heat's lineup, because with Haslem and Chris Bosh often more perimeter oriented, the Thunder may need to go small. Edge: Thunder.

**power forward**

Serge Ibaka vs. Shane Battier or Chris Bosh. Ibaka has turned into more than just one of the NBA's top defensive players, having a 26-point outing on 11-of-11 shooting in Game 4 of the Western Conference finals. He is hooting 55.6 percent in the postseason, best among players who advanced past the first round. The Heat have options for their rotation now that Bosh looks back to full strength after coring 19 points and making three 3-pointers in the Heat's Game 7 victory over Boston to win the East. Battier, whose shot had been off most of the postseason, made four 3s in the game and hit three in both games against Oklahoma City during the season. Edge: Even.

**shooting guard**

Kevin Durant vs. LeBron James. Durant is the best scorer in the NBA, and probably the best all-around player. That includes his defense, and though Durant is a three-time scoring champion who has stretches where he's unstoppable, James has as good a chance as anybody in the league. He helped force Durant into a career-high nine turnovers in Miami's 98-93 home victory. And it's James who is actually the best scorer in this postseason, averaging 30.8 points. Edge: Heat.

**point guard**

Russell Westbrook vs. Mario Chalmers. The Heat had all kinds of trouble with the Celtics' Rajon Rondo and they sure won't like playing against Westbrook, another speedy, do-everything point guard. He is prone to some poor shooting nights, such as 4 for 16 and 9 for 26 efforts in the regular season against Miami, but has the potential to be the force that Rondo was. Edge: Thunder.

**reserves**

James Harden, Derek Fisher, Nick Collison, Daequan Cook and Nazr Mohammed vs. Bosh or Battier, Mike Miller, Joel Anthony, Ronny Turiaf and Norris Cole. If Bosh continues to play as a reserve, as he has in the three games since returning from a strained lower abdominal, Miami has some punch off the bench. Even so, the Thunder are better behind Sixth Man of the Year Harden, and Fisher is always good for a big shot or two this time of year. Edge: Thunder.

**coaches**

Scott Brooks vs. Erik Spoelstra. Spoelstra was outcoached by Rick Carlisle in last year's finals but gets another chance now, seemingly with his full complement of players to allow him to mix and match. Brooks appears to have more options, and the 2010 Coach of the Year's move to change his defensive coverage and put Sefolosha on Parker in the last round slowed a Spurs team that had been in an offensive groove for weeks. Edge: Thunder.

**season series**

Tied, 1-1. The Thunder forced 21 turnovers and rolled to a victory at home on March 25 before the Heat allied for a win in Miami on April 4. Durant averaged 29 points, though omitted a career-high nine turnovers while scoring 30 in the second game. Westbrook made 13 of 42 shots while coring 20.5 per game, and Ibaka and Harden each scored 19 points in the Thunder's win, but combined for only 16 in the rematch. James had 34 points in Miami, doubling his total from Oklahoma City, and added 10 assists and seven rebounds. Wade averaged 0.5 points and Bosh added 15.

**story line**

James and Durant, two of the league's biggest superstars, go head-to-head in search of their first championships. Considered the favorites last year when they fell to Dallas in the first year with James, Wade and Bosh together, the Heat are the underdogs this time against the Thunder, who are poised to reach the

top of the NBA despite a core of young players in only their early 20s.

**Key matchup I**

Durant vs. James. James will try to add the finals MVP trophy to the regular-season award he beat out Durant to claim. Whoever's team wins the series earns an advantage in the debate as to who is the best player in the game. Besides everything he has to do offensively, James must use his considerable defensive skills to slow down Durant, who won his third straight scoring title this season. James is the top scorer in the postseason, averaging 30.8 points.

**Key matchup II**

Ibaka vs. Battier and Bosh. Ibaka, the league's leading shot blocker and runner-up for Defensive Player of the Year, has turned into more than just a one-way player. He shot 11 for 11, hitting a number of jumpers, in the Thunder's Game 4 victory over San Antonio that evened the Western Conference finals, and his 55.6 shooting percentage is tops in the playoffs among players who advanced past the first round. Heat coach Erik Spoelstra will have to decide whether to return Bosh to the starting lineup or stay with Battier, and both looked like good choices in Miami's Game 7 victory over Boston in the Eastern Conference finals. Bosh scored 19 points and made three 3-pointers in his third game back after a nine-game absence because of a lower abdominal injury, while Battier nailed four 3-pointers.

**X-factor**

Perkins. He doesn't have the offensive game of Indiana's Roy Hibbert or the Celtics' Kevin Garnett, centers who have hurt the Heat in this postseason. But Perkins had his best offensive game of the season with 16 points in the Thunder's regular-season victory over the Heat. If he provides any type of scoring in this series, it will cause problems for a Heat team that hasn't been able to settle on and stay committed to a center option all season.
