 • There was rejoicing at Zeeland last week on the success of their high school baseball team. They didn't win the state title, but they did advance to the state tournament and were named consolation co-champs with Lansford.
 • The 50th anniversary festivities of the Ventura Baptist Church will begin Friday evening. The Rev. Raymond Dickau of Parkersburg, IA, former pastor of the church from 1949-1957, will be the guest speaker.
