RE: Reservation Telephone Cooperative-

This letter is intended to resolve for, Reservation Telephone Cooperative (Reservation) all outstanding issues that Verizon has raised with respect to the VoIP/PSTN tariff filing by BEK Communications, Cooperative, (BEK) that was filed with the North Dakota Public Service Commission (NDPSC) on March 5, 2012, by John Staurulakis, Inc. (JSI) on behalf of BEK. Reservation has yet to file separate VoIP/PSTN tariff revisions with the NDPSC, and effective July 1, 2012, Reservation will follow the VoIP/PSTN Tariff language found in North Dakota Intrastate Access Tariff No. 1 (NDIAT), which was approved by the NDPSC in an Order issued June 27, 2012. As you know, the VoIP/PSTN tariff provisions found in the NDIAT are very similar to the provisions that were filed by JSI on behalf of several other companies in North Dakota. Accordingly, Reservation believes that under the circumstances, this letter remains appropriate and is intended to resolve the same issues with respect to Verizon and Reservation.

In regards to Verizon's first issue regarding the language contained in Section 2.1.1.G of the BEK tariff revisions, which corresponds with Section 6.1.6.G of the NDIAT VoIP/PSTN tariff language, Reservation indicates that at the appropriate time in the future, it will file tariff revisions with the NDPSC outlining how their PVU factor will be determined, once it becomes necessary for Reservation to compute a PVU factor due to the introduction of VoIP/PSTN traffic on Reservation's network. This future filing will remove all uncertainty regarding how Reservation's PVU factor will be determined.

In regards to Verizon's second issue regarding the effective date of the implementation of interstate access rates as the basis for pricing traffic designated as VoIP/PSTN traffic by Verizon, Reservation agrees to begin assessing interstate access rates for such designated VoIP/PSTN traffic as of January 1, 2012.
