## MISCELLANEOUS SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS

### 5.1 LOW INCOME PROGRAMS

The Company, as part of its obligations as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier, offers three low-income assistance programs. These programs, Lifeline Assistance, Tribal Lands Lifeline and Tribal Lands Link Up are offered under the terms and conditions provided below:

#### 5.1.1 Lifeline Assistance

##### A. General

Lifeline Assistance is a retail service offering available to qualifying low-income subscribers, as provided for below. Lifeline Assistance enables eligible subscribers to pay reduced charges for voice telephony services including: voice grade access to the public switched network; local usage or its functional equivalent; access to emergency services; and toll limitation.

##### B. Regulations

1. Unless other eligibility requirements are established, Lifeline Assistance is available to all subscribers who participate in one of the following programs: Medicaid, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Supplemental Security Income; Federal Public Housing Assistance; Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program; National School Lunch Program's free lunch program, or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families. In addition, consumers who have a household income equal to or less than 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines are eligible for support.
2. Each subscriber to Lifeline Assistance must certify in writing to the Company, under penalty of perjury, that they receive benefits under a program outlined in sub-paragraph (B) (1) above. The Company shall retain all such subscriber certifications in order to furnish proof of subscriber eligibility as may be required from time to time by Universal Service administrators.

**5.1.1 Lifeline Assistance (cont'd)**

3. A subscriber may elect at the time of subscription to Lifeline Assistance to receive toll restriction as part of Lifeline Assistance. "Toll Restriction" is a service that allows a subscriber to elect not to allow the completion of outgoing toll calls from the subscriber's residence.
4. The Company may not collect a service deposit in order to initiate Lifeline Assistance if the qualifying low-income subscriber voluntarily elects toll restriction from the Company.

Life line Assistance provides a Federal baseline reduction from the subscriber's monthly service bill. See Section 10 for discount rates.

The Company shall apply the baseline payments received by the administration of the Federal Lifeline Assistance Program to waive the qualifying customer's Federal End-User Common Line Charge, The Company shall apply any additional federal support amount to the qualifying customer's basic local exchange service rate.

Partial payments that are received from Lifeline customers shall first be applied to local service charges and then to any outstanding toll charges.

**5.1.2 Tribal Lands Lifeline**

A. General

Eligible residents of Tribal Lands, can lower their charges for primary local telephone service. It does not cover costs for long distance, E-911, optional features or taxes and state-mandated fees. Residents of Tribal Lands who qualify for regular Lifeline are also eligible for Tribal Lifeline support.

**5.1.3 Tribal Lands Link Up**

**A. General**

Tribal Lands Link Up provides a reduction in the Company's customary charge for commencing telecommunications service for a single telecommunications connection at a subscriber's principal place of residence. Charges assessed for commencing service include any charges that the Company customarily assesses to connect subscribers to the network. These charges do not include any permissible security deposit requirements.

**B. Regulations**

1. Tribal Lands Link Up is available to all subscribers who are residents on a Tribal Land in which the Company receives High Cost Support.
2. Unless other eligibility requirements are established, Tribal Link Up Assistance is available to residents of Tribal Lands who receive benefits under one of the following programs:

**10.3.1 Lifeline Discounts**

**The Federal End User charge is waived.**

- A. Additional Federal Lifeline Assistance support \$3.50.
- B. Additional Tribal Land Lifeline \$15.45.
- C. Toll blocking can be included for eligible Lifeline consumers without charge. No service deposit would be required if the applicant voluntarily elects toll blocking with the initiation of Lifeline Service.

**10.3.2 Tribal Lands Link up**

- A. Tribal Land residents are eligible for a 100% reduction, up to \$100.00, off the customary charge for commencing telecommunications service for a single telecommunications connection at a subscriber's principal place of residence providing the eligible telecommunications carrier is receiving high-cost support for that specific Tribal Land.
- B. Support also provides a deferred schedule for payment of the charges assessed for commencing service, for which the subscriber does not pay interest. The interest charges not assessed to the subscriber shall be for connection charges of up to \$200.00 that are deferred for a period not to exceed one year.
- C. An eligible resident of Tribal Lands may receive the benefit of the Tribal Link Up program for a second or subsequent time only for otherwise qualifying commencement of telecommunications service at a principal place of residence with an address different from the address for which Tribal Link Up assistance was provided previously.

### 5.1.3 Tribal Lands Link Up (cont'd)

#### B. Regulations

1. Tribal Lands Link Up is available to all subscribers who are residents on a Tribal Land in which the Company receives High Cost Support.
2. Unless other eligibility requirements are established, Tribal Link Up Assistance is available to residents of Tribal Lands who receive benefits under one of the following programs: Medicaid, ~~Heating Assistance, WIC, Federal Public Housing Assistance, Food Distribution Program, Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribally administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Head Start or Early Head Start (only those meeting its income qualifying standard), National School Free Lunch Program, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental~~
