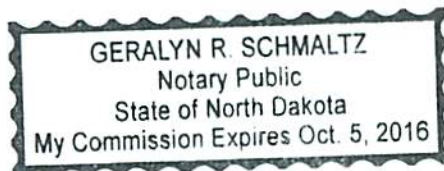

NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

On September 17, 2012 ONEOK Rockies Midstream, L.L.C. (ONEOK) submitted an application for a certificate of site compatibility for the construction of a 100 million standard cubic feet per day gas processing plant to be located in McKenzie County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map.

On October 10, 2012, the Commission found the application is complete.

A Public Hearing on the application is scheduled to begin December 11, 2012, at 1:30 p.m. CST at the Watford City Civic Center, 213 2nd Street NE, Watford City, North Dakota, 58854.

The issues to be considered in ONEOK's application for a certificate of site compatibility are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facility produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
