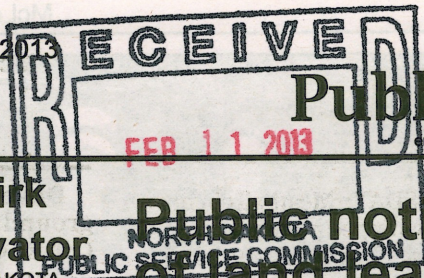

The regular Riverdale City Council meeting of January 14, 2013 was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Skuza.

Schulz moved to approve the December 3, 2012 meeting minutes. Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Dempsey moved to approve the bills. Anderson seconded. Motion carried.

Schulz moved to rebid water main and electrical utility improvements for Community Development Grant on behalf of McCleery project. Anderson seconded. Roll Call: Schulz aye, Dempsey aye, Anderson aye. Motion carried.
