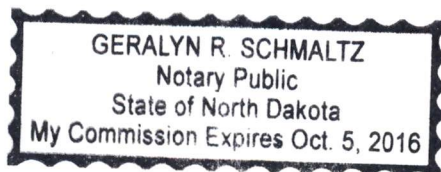



**NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING  
December 18, 2013**

On October 16, 2013, Basin Electric Power Cooperative filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of two new 45 MW natural gas fired simple cycle combustion turbine generators to be located adjacent to the 45 MW turbine generator currently under construction at the Lonesome Creek Generating station in McKinzie County, North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

A **Public Hearing** on the application is scheduled to begin on **January 28, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. CST at Teddy's Residential Suites, 113 9<sup>th</sup> Ave SE, Watford City, ND 58854**. The issues to be considered are:

1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
