RE: North Dakota Pipeline Company LLC Meeting with University of North Dakota
Representatives Regarding the Oakville Environmental Research Station on March 21,
2014

Mr. Nitschke:

Please be advised that representatives from the University of North Dakota (UND) and North Dakota Pipeline Company LLC (NDPL) met on Friday, March 24, 2014 to discuss the proposed Sandpiper Pipeline Project route across property that now encompasses the Oakville Environmental Research Station. The parties discussed NDPL's installation of its Line 81 in 1962, various maintenance activities that took place on the property, including two (2) integrity maintenance digs during 2012, depth of cover for Line 81 and Sandpiper, various flora and fauna surveys performed on the property by both parties, the various research projects performed on the property by UND and other institutions, construction crossing methods and mitigation efforts to be deployed, and future research and activities scheduled to take place on the property.

Over the next two to three weeks, UND will consult with additional representatives from its Biology Department, including the UND Field Station Committee, to discuss the Sandpiper Pipeline Project's crossing of the property, as well as develop a list of requests in order to mitigate effects on the property and coordinate construction. Subsequently, the parties will meet to review and discuss those requests.

In short, the parties believe that the discussion will continue to be productive and that a partnership opportunity exists here for both parties' benefit. Pending the completion of our discussions in the next several weeks, the parties also believe that the North Dakota Public Service Commission's consideration of NDPL's Sandpiper Pipeline Project application and issuance of the Route Permit and Certificate of Corridor Compatibility may proceed accordingly giving due regard to these collective efforts.
