

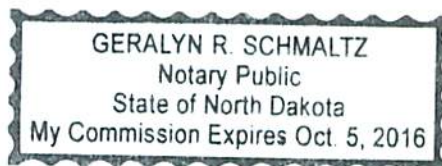

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING
January 15, 2014

On December 31, 2013, Otter Tail Power Company (Otter Tail) filed a request for approval of its 2013 Renewable Resource Cost Recovery Adjustment Factor (Factor) for recovering costs associated with its wind farms. The proposal would reduce the current Factor from \$0.00518 per kWh to \$0.00440 for a decrease of 57¢ per month for a typical residential customer using 733 kWh.


The issues to be considered in this matter are:

1. What is Otter Tail's rate of return on its property, used and useful, for the service and convenience of the public in North Dakota?
2. What is a just and reasonable rate of return on Otter Tail's property, used and useful, for the service and convenience of the public in North Dakota?
3. What rates and charges are necessary to provide a just and reasonable rate of return on Otter Tail's property, used and useful, for the service and convenience of the public in North Dakota?
4. Are Otter Tail's proposed rates designed in such a manner that they result in a basis of charge to its customers that is just and reasonable without discrimination?
5. Other relevant information or proposals concerning the proceeding.

Comments and requests for a hearing must be received by **February 28, 2014**. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. If deemed appropriate, the commission can determine these matters without a hearing.
