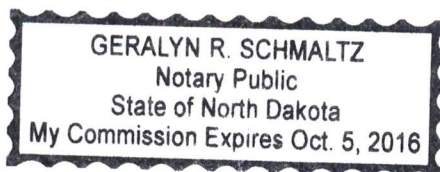

NOTICE OF FILING AND NOTICE OF HEARING

April 9, 2013

On March 19, 2014, Sunflower Wind Project, LLC filed an application for a certificate of site compatibility to authorize construction of a 110 MW Sunflower Wind Energy Project consisting of up to 59 wind turbine generators and associated facilities in Stark and Morton Counties of North Dakota as shown on the attached map.

A **Public Hearing** on the application is scheduled to begin **May 12, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. CDT, at the Hebron Community Center, 620 Washington Ave, Hebron, North Dakota 58638.** The issues to be considered are:


1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?











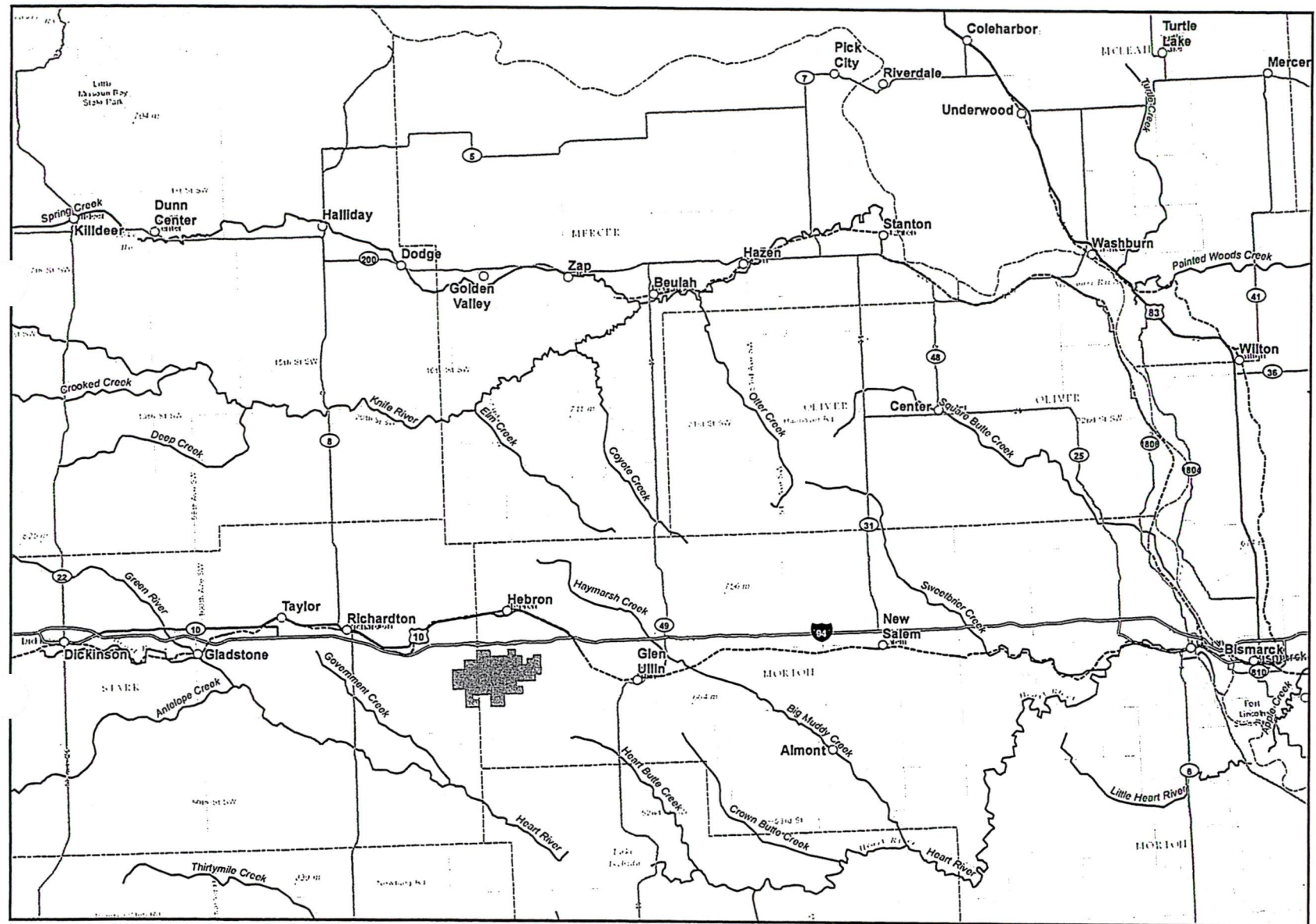

Site Compatibility

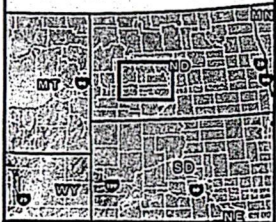
Figure 1

April 2014

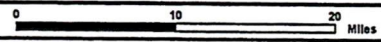
