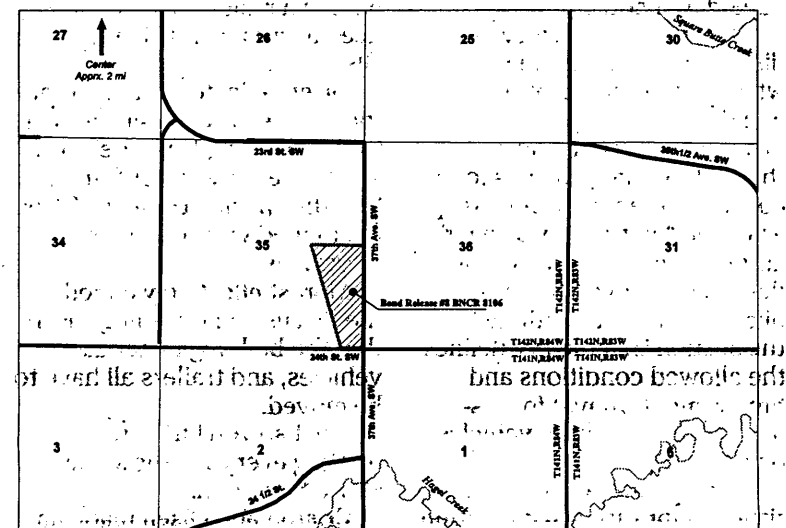
LEGAL NOTICE NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO RELEASE PERFORMANCE BOND

BNI Coal, Ltd., 2360 35th Avenue SW, Center, ND 58530-9499 has submitted an application to the North Dakota Public Service Commission to release the following tract of land from all phases (I-IV) of bond release and all remaining reclamation liabilities: 58.23 acres in Permit BNCR-8106 in the SE ¼ of Section 35, T142N, R84W in Oliver County. Permit BNCR-8106 was approved on July 19, 1983. The bond release tract was initially permitted under Permit 24, approved on December 5, 1973 and Permit 37, approved on September 20, 1976. No monetary release is requested since the bond amount is based on the worst-case reclamation condition for the consolidated bond area that includes Permits BNCR-8106, BNCR-9702, BNCR-8202 and BNCR-8602. The current bond amount is \$34,139,439.00. The bond release tract is described below and depicted on the attached map.

Initial disturbance on the bond release tract occurred in 1974 in preparation for coal removal. The mining of lignite began in 1975 and continued

through 1983. Reclamation consisting of grading, SPGM respread, and seeding occurred between 1980 and 1989. The post mine land uses for this tract consist of 53.05 acres of tame pasture and 5.18 acres right of way that includes a portion of the reclaimed county road (37th Ave. SW). No mining disturbance occurred on 1.46 acres along the southern boundary of the tract.

Copies of the bond release request and supporting documents are on file at the Oliver County Auditors Office, Center, ND 58530, and the Office of the Director of the Reclamation Division, ND Public Service Commission, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, ND 58505-0480. Any person having a valid legal interest, which is or may be adversely affected by release of the bond has the right to file written comments or objections, may request an informal conference or public hearing regarding the proposed releases from bond with the North Dakota Public Service Commission, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, ND 58505-0480 within thirty (30) days after the last publication of this notice.

if they can re-sign Draymond Green and move David Lee, then they'll be fine. I can actually see them parting with their first-round pick and Lee if they get the right deal.
