This email notification is to allow you or someone from the USFWS North Dakota Field Office the opportunity to comment on a pipeline project in McKenzie County. Previous telephone correspondence with Heidi Riddle regarding this project was conducted on July 1, 2014, however I understand that she is no longer with USFWS.

Caliber Midstream Partners (Caliber) has submitted applications to the North Dakota Public Services Commission (PSC) for a Route Permit and Certificate of Corridor Compatibility associated with a 4.4-mile-long, 6 inch-diameter natural gas liquids (NGL) pipeline (Project) in McKenzie County, North Dakota. In accordance with PSC guidelines, this email is to notify you of the Project and respectfully request that you submit any questions or comments by November 5, 2014. Any comments or questions submitted by this date will be provided to the PSC and addressed during the scheduled public hearing on November 6, 2014.

The Project has been installed but is not operational. There are four additional pipelines (e.g., gathering and water pipelines) located within the same 100-foot right-of-way (ROW) as the Project. All five pipelines were constructed within one ROW because of agreements in place between Caliber and the seven private landowners affected by the Project. The agreements required Caliber to install all anticipated pipelines simultaneously within one ROW to minimize impacts to productive agricultural land. The pipeline was originally (at the time of installation) intended to be utilized for gas gathering from the well pads located along the route. When the gas transport deal failed to materialize from these well pads, it was decided to utilize the installed pipeline to transport NGLs from a nearby gas processing plant.

This email notification is to allow you or someone from the North Dakota Game and Fish Department the opportunity to comment on a pipeline project in McKenzie County. On July 1, 2014, Katy Reagan of Sunbird Biological spoke with you about this project. This email is a follow-up to that discussion.

Caliber Midstream Partners (Caliber) has submitted applications to the North Dakota Public Services Commission (PSC) for a Route Permit and Certificate of Corridor Compatibility associated with a 4.4-mile-long, 6 inch-diameter natural gas liquids (NGL) pipeline (Project) in McKenzie County, North Dakota. In accordance with PSC guidelines, this email is to notify you of the Project and respectfully request that you submit any questions or comments by November 5, 2014.
