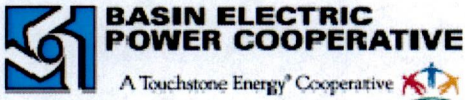

The Board of Commissioners of McKenzie County, North Dakota met at the Commissioner's Room at the McKenzie County Courthouse in Watford City, North Dakota on April 21, 2015. Present: Commissioners Richard Cayko, Ron Anderson, Vawnta Best, and Kathy Skarda, Auditor Svihovec, Deputy Auditor Johnsrud, and State's Attorney Rodenbiker. Absent: Commissioner Doug Nordby. Chairman Cayko called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

At this meeting, the following motions were made pertaining to the Planning and Zoning Consent Agenda.

Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to approve Planning and Zoning Consent Agenda Items 3-5 and 7-13 as published. All voting aye, motion carried.

For Consent Agenda Item 1, Paradigm—Text Zone CUP, Commissioner Skarda asked to include garbage control effective upon approval and that the Emergency Response Plan should include direct communication with landowners within one mile of the site. For Consent Agenda Item 2, Basin Electric, Commissioner Skarda asked that a map of the re-route be included in the plan.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Best, to approve Items 1 and 2 for approval with the changes recommended by Skarda. Anderson abstained. All others voting aye, motion carried.

For clarification purposes, Item 2 on the Consent Agenda was the Basin Electric CUP (N. Killdeer Loop Phase 1-Transmission Line) and Item 13 on the Consent Agenda was the Basin Electric CUP (Lonesome Creek Generation Station Phase III). Both items were approved by the McKenzie County Board of Commissioners.

**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE
BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
MCKENZIE COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA**

April 7, 2015

The Board of Commissioners of McKenzie County, North Dakota met at the Commissioner's Room at the McKenzie County Courthouse in Watford City, North Dakota on April 7, 2015. Present: Commissioners Richard Cayko, Doug Nordby, Ron Anderson, Vawnita Best, and Kathy Skarda, Auditor Svihovec, Deputy Auditor Johnsrud, and State's Attorney Rodenbiker. Chairman Cayko called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Brad Solberg presented the Treasurer's Report for the period ending March 31, 2015.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to approve the Treasurer's Report, Minutes, and bills as presented. All voting aye, motion carried.

Motor Vehicle Branch Manager Winchester notified the Board that on May 1, 2015, she will become the County's passport agent. Winchester updated the Board on the appointment hours of service and fees, which will be \$25.00 per application and \$5.00 for photos.

The Board discussed an office décor request from District Judge Schmidt. Consensus of Board was that County funds would not be provided for office décor other than the front entry.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Anderson, to direct State's Attorney Rodenbiker to write a letter to Alexander Rural Fire District expressing concern over imposing fees related to zoning permits without statutory authorization to do so. All voting aye, motion carried.

Auditor Svihovec presented an updated revised budget for 2015 and 2016, which included a revised revenue forecast and revised road project estimates with at 15% reduction in CIP estimate, as well as law enforcement center project and offsite expenses. Svihovec reported that revised projections show a minimum of \$62 Million shortfall over 2015 and 2016 budget years.

Myron Knutson and Scott Wegner presented bonding and financing options for the County. ICON Architectural group also presented law enforcement center design changes that would save up to \$8.5 Million total. Sheriff Schwartzenberger presented reasons for not reducing the planned size of the law enforcement center construction project.

At 11:00am the Board moved to the Auditor's Conference Room where Commissioners Cayko, Nordby, Anderson, Best, and Skarda and Auditor Svihovec held a conference call with Brad Thompson from the Bank of North Dakota to discuss loan options for the County.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to approve the Bankhead Jones Distribution, as presented. All voting aye, motion carried.

At 1:00pm a public hearing was held on the combination of the Auditor's and Treasurer's Offices. Two members of the public, Cheryl Grantier and Patsy Levang, spoke in opposition to the combination out of concern of legal ramifications, separation of workload, and checks and balances.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to authorize Chairman Cayko to sign the contract for Bypass Access Control after review by State's Attorney Rodenbiker. All voting aye, motion carried.

Landfill Manager Schreiber requested approval to waive landfill fees for Pick Up the Patch on May 2, as well as to waive fees for the Law Enforcement Center construction project. Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve waiving landfill fees as requested. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve Landfill Manager Schreiber's request to close the landfill on Saturdays until further notice. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to approve the temporary encroachment permit application from Slawson Exploration for one year, to April 7, 2016, to open and reclaim the section line: Sections 1 and 12, Township 151 North, Range 95 West and to notify the McKenzie County Auditor when the site has been reclaimed. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to approve the contract with Construction Engineers for the Law Enforcement Center project. Anderson withdrew his motion and the topic was tabled until the April 21, 2015, meeting to allow time for the State's Attorney to review the recommended changes.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve executing the agreement with Haan & Associates pending obtaining successful foreign business registration with the Secretary of State. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to approve \$2.00 per hour (to \$25.10) for two operators, Jamie Norstog & Jeremy Smith, upon completion of certification exams. Certification raises will no longer be part of the County's compensation offers. All voting aye, motion carried.

The Board directed HR Manager Willis to research the classification of the C-banded employees, to research comparable pay for landfill directors in the region, and to research overtime compensation policies for exempt employees and make a recommendation to the Board.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve the raffle permit application from the Grassy Butte Community Club. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Nordby, to adopt the following McKenzie County Burn Ban Resolution as presented by DES Coordinator Rockvoy.

MCKENZIE COUNTY BURN BAN RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, McKenzie County, North Dakota has very dry conditions with significant fuel supplies available; and

WHEREAS, McKenzie County, North Dakota has sustained or been threatened with rural fires as of this date, and the McKenzie County Department of Emergency Services has been in consultation with local fire departments; and

WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, the cost of response, inordinate equipment wear and fire damages may be in excess of County resources.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of McKenzie County Commissioners declare a Fire Emergency and Burn Ban to include a ban on ignition of fireworks, garbage burning, campfires, burning of farm or crop land and unnecessary off-road motorized travel when the North Dakota Rangeland Fire Index is in the High, Very High, or Extreme category and/or a Red Flag Warning has been issued for McKenzie County, North Dakota. ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THE BURN BAN IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.1-10: MAXIMUM SENTENCE OF 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$1500 FINE), AND RESTITUTION OF FIRE SUPPRESSION COSTS MAY BE SOUGHT FROM THE COURT.

Dated this 7th Day of April, 2015, McKenzie County North Dakota. Ending October 31, 2015. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to eliminate the fiber line installation from the Courthouse to the LE Center site. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Nordby, to approve a policy to permanently ban streaming music and video on County computers. With a vote of 4 aye and 1 nay (Cayko), motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to approve Change Order #5 for the Courthouse Project, \$387,327.78, which includes wireless drops, court recorder offices, casework, and the Hillside Court retaining wall. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve the proposal from US Imaging for Clerk of Court and Planning & Zoning document scanning. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to execute the Affidavit of Possession as Corrective Title Action for Lot 3, Block 1, Third Addition to Watford City. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to award Route 53 bid to Border States Paving for \$9,357,049.06; to approve the S&S Motors proposal for two pickups at \$31,687.10 each; and to award the bid for construction staking on Route 53 to Brosz Engineering for \$108,000. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Nordby, to approve Options 2-11, as presented by ICON Architects, for reductions for the Law Enforcement Center project, estimated at \$3 Million. With 4 votes aye, and 1 vote nay (Anderson), motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Best, to approve the loan with the Bank of North Dakota for a maximum of \$60 Million for the Law Enforcement Center. With 4 votes aye, and 1 vote nay (Anderson), motion carried.

Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to approve Planning and Zoning Consent Agenda Items 3-5 and 7-13 as published. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to adopt the Final Resolution to Combine the Auditor and Treasurer Offices.

**FINAL RESOLUTION TO COMBINE THE OFFICES OF
McKENZIE COUNTY AUDITOR & McKENZIE COUNTY TREASURER**

WHEREAS, on 3 March 2015, the Board of County Commissioners adopted a preliminary resolution and approved a plan for combining the offices of McKenzie County Auditor and McKenzie County Treasurer as provided by Chapter 11-10.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, and

WHEREAS, the preliminary resolution and proposed plan were published in the McKenzie County Farmer at least once during two different weeks within the thirty-day period immediately following the adoption of the preliminary resolution, and

WHEREAS, the preliminary resolution and proposed plan were the subject of public hearings held during each of the regularly-scheduled meetings of the Board of County Commissioner on Tuesday 17 March 2015 and Tuesday 7 April 2015, in order to encourage public discussion of the purpose, conclusions, and recommendations of the plan, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is satisfied adoption of the proposed plan will improve the effectiveness and efficiency of county government and its responsiveness and accountability to local citizens, without diminishing the general

responsibility of county government to perform any function or provide any service that is required by law to be performed or provided by county government,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the terms of the proposed plan approved 3 March 2015 be affirmed and finalized, so that effective 1 May 2015 the offices of McKenzie County Auditor and McKenzie County Treasurer are and shall be combined, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the approved plan shall be filed both with the District Court in McKenzie County and with the McKenzie County Auditor. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve the abatement and refund applications for 2013 and 2014 for Terry Neidhardt. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to award the Aggregate Stockpile bid to Plote Construction for \$2,239,400.00. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to award the Summer Supplies bids as follows: for 2015 Crushing to Sundre Sand & Gravel, for 2015 Culverts to True North Steel, and for 2015 Cattle guard Cleaning to Rink Construction at \$245.00/hour. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Dollinger reported that Eldean Flynn had contacted him regarding rip rapping the bank of the Yellowstone River in Section 32, Township 150N, Range 104W. It was the consensus of the Board that other opportunities should be used due to cost and permits required.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to award the bid for Northern Bypass Phase I (County Route 10) to Central Specialties for \$29,408,335.32. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Best, to award the bid for 7.1 miles of Route 30 to Knife River Corporation for \$10,197,824.36. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to award the bid to Wanzek Construction for 22nd St. Bridge BRO-0027(041) as an 80/20 project for a total of \$793,031.40. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve the Cattle Guard permit application from Randall Stevenson on 122nd Ave NW, Section 10, Township 149N, Range 98W. All voting aye, motion carried.

The Board approved Dollinger pursuing a lease for a new gravel pit in the County.

HR Manager Willis updated the Board on the Fox-Lawson salary/classification system.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Best, to accept the resignation from Walter Hadley with regret, Building & Planning Department Director, effective May 1, 2015. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve HR Manager Willis to advertise for Planning & Building Department director at a salary range of \$85,000-110,000, utilizing a recruitment agency if she deems necessary. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Best, seconded by Anderson, to approve the Planning & Building Director position to fall under the supervision of the Public Works Director. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to approve the liquor license application from Patriot Fuels, LLC pending a schematic floorplan drawing. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Anderson, to adopt the Emergency Declaration for the Tobacco Gardens Fire on April 14, 2015. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve the Emergency Responders Night budget up to a maximum of \$12,000.00. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Best, to move the regular July 7, 2015, meeting to July 1, 2015, at 9:00am. All voting aye, motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 3:42p.m. until May 5, 2015, at 9:00 a.m.
