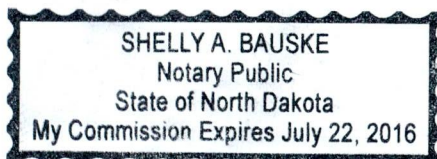

**NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING**

**April 21, 2015**

The North Dakota Public Service Commission's (Commission) May 18, 2011 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order (Order) in Case No. PU-10-666, issued to ONEOK Rockies Midstream, L.L.C. (ONEOK) a Certificate designating a site for the Stateline I and Stateline II Gas Processing Plants.

On March 12, 2015 and March 31, 2015, ONEOK filed letters notify the Commission under North Dakota Century Code 49-22-03(3), that ONEOK intends to modify the Stateline I and II Gas Processing Plants to include a deethanizer for the extraction of ethane (Project).

The issues to be considered in this proceeding are:


1. Will the location, construction, and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?


At its April 21, 2015 work session, the Commission determined that it would delegate authority to staff to approve the Project subject to the issuance of a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing providing opportunity for comments or requests for hearing on the Project. Consequently, staff's April 21, 2015 approval of the Project is conditioned on expiration of the Notice period without receipt of any comments or requests for hearing.

Those interested are invited to comment on the Project in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. **Comments and requests for hearing must be received by May 21, 2015.** If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.
