Dear Mr. Nitschke:

On January 5, 2016, the North Dakota Public Service Commission (“Commission”) issued its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order granting Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 177 and Route Permit No. 189 to Sacagawea Pipeline Company, LLC (“Sacagawea”) for the approximately 70-mile long, 16-inch diameter crude oil pipeline and associated facilities, known as the Sacagawea Pipeline Project (“Project”), to be located in McKenzie and Mountrail Counties, North Dakota. The Certification Relating to Order Provisions – Transmission Facility Siting (“Certification”) executed by Sacagawea was incorporated by reference and attached to the order.

On July 1, 2016, the Commission issued its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order on Amended Corridor and Amended Route granting First Amended Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 177 and First Amended Route Permit No. 189 to Sacagawea (hereinafter referred to as the “Order”), with attached Certification. In accordance with Provision No. 31 of the Certification, Sacagawea submits this notification letter to inform the Commission of plans to modify the transmission facility and allow the Project to be utilized for bi-directional flow.

As set forth in the Consolidated Application for a Certificate of Corridor Compatibility and Route Permit (“Application”) for the Project, and in testimony presented at the public hearing held on August 21, 2015, the Project will originate at Paradigm Midstream Service’s Keene terminal, located near Keene in McKenzie County, and will terminate at the Phillips 66 Partners’ Palermo Rail Terminal, located near Palermo in Mountrail County. Language regarding the origination and termination points of the Project is also included in the Order. While the direction of crude oil flow is not specifically set forth in the Order, the Order language seems to assume that oil will flow in one direction. Sacagawea herein provides notice to the Commission that Sacagawea intends to utilize the Project for bi-directional flow.

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The bi-directional flow option of the Project will be utilized to adapt to existing and future market needs along the Project route. In utilizing the Project for bi-directional flow, no design modifications are required for the Project and no additional facilities are anticipated to be constructed. Given the language set forth in Certification Provision No. 31, Sacagawea herein provides notice of the minor modification to the Project.
