**RE: Hiland Crude, LLC - Case No. PU-15-486
Request for Supplemental Information**

Dear Mr. Nitschke:

This letter is in follow up to a request received from your office for supplemental information in support of Hiland Crude, LLC's ("Hiland") Application for a Certificate of Corridor Compatibility and Route Permit ("Application") for the Alexander Tank Farm Crude Oil Pipeline (the "Project") filed with the North Dakota Public Service Commission ("Commission") on July 8, 2015. In response to the Commission's requests, Hiland provides the following information and documentation where appropriate.

The Commission requested a more detailed map for publication in the appropriate county newspaper. An updated black and white map suitable for publication is attached.

There is one residence within five hundred feet of the Project. As allowed under North Dakota Century Code Section 49-22-05.1, the "five hundred foot [152.4 meter] avoidance area criteria for an inhabited rural residence may be waived by the owner of the inhabited rural residence in writing." Hiland has obtained a waiver from the one residence owner as allowed under Section 49-22-05.1. The waiver is included herewith.

As noted in the Application, the North Dakota State Historic Preservation Office ("SHPO") was provided with the Class III Cultural Resource Inventory report issued by Beaver Creek Archaeology, Inc. and concurred with a finding of "No Significant Sites." The SHPO concurrence letter dated July 31, 2014, is enclosed herewith.

The requisite agency correspondence has been initiated for the Project. A spreadsheet indicating the status of all agency correspondence commenced with respect to the Project is attached herewith. Also included are copies of letters or e-mails sent to various agencies noted

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on the spreadsheet, along with additional responses. A full copy of the response received from the North Dakota Department of Health is also attached.


The Commission has also requested copies of all permits obtained for the Project. The Application makes reference to a Pipeline Utility Permit and a Road Crossing Permit having been obtained for the Project. The attached "McKenzie County Consent for Utility Company to Cross a Public Road or Section Road" was the only permit obtained in this regard.

The Commission has requested clarification regarding pump stations associated with the Project based on an e-mail received from the McKenzie County Planning and Zoning Department in response to the agency notification letter for the Project. The pump station as noted in the agency correspondence letter was not constructed as outlined therein, so no pump station exists for the Project.

The last item for clarification is with respect to whether fenced-in enclosures have been installed for the Project to allow valves to be operated remotely, or whether this construction will occur in the future. The fenced-in enclosures have already been installed to house associated power and control systems to allow valves to be operated remotely. No additional enclosures are required at this time.

All documents referenced above include an original and ten (10) copies for filing. Also enclosed herewith is a CD containing electronic versions of all documents. If you should have any questions regarding the enclosed supplemental information, please advise.
