INFORMATION REGARDING EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

At the October 29, 2015 public hearing for the Certificate of Corridor Compatibility and Route Permit Application submitted by Plains Pipeline, L.P. ("Plains") for the Highway 1804 Re-Route North Pipeline Project ("Project"), the North Dakota Public Service Commission requested that Plains provide additional information regarding the Emergency Response Plan applicable to the Project. The Project falls under Plains All American Pipeline, L.P.'s existing Spill Response Plan for the Rocky Mountain Crude Zone. This plan was submitted to PHMSA on November 24, 2014 and approved by PHMSA on December 29, 2014. A copy of PHMSA's letter of approval is attached. Once the Project is complete, the pipe specifications and the pipeline maps for the Project will be updated with PHMSA.
