Good evening:

I am following up with you regarding the Commission's work session on this matter that took place yesterday.

Matt: Will CCSC be submitting a late filed exhibit concerning usage of drones in/around wind farms?

Brian: The Commission had questions concerning the following

- 1) The 1 mile setback for Highway 22 in the project area, was this part of the CUP granted by the County?
- 2) On late filed exhibit 8, what are the turbine locations/numbers for the 16 non-participating landowners listed where shadow flicker is anticipated to have an impact. Where are the affected inhabited dwellings of the non-participating landowners? Also, how does the potential removal of turbines 82, 83, 84 impact shadow flicker?
- 3) Does Brady Wind understand that the bond attained to satisfy Stark County does not equate to meeting the requirements under the PSC rules for decommissioning?
- 4) If complaints concerning noise are fielded, can an individual turbine or group of turbines be turned off for testing of noise?
- 5) Commissioner Christmann brought up Dr. Ollson's testimony concerning impact on health and that placement of a turbine within 1000 feet of an occupied dwelling could have adverse impacts. Given the county setback requirement is 2000 feet from an occupied structure, and the PSC's setback for a non-participating landowner's property line is 1.1 times the height of the turbine (about 500 feet), what is the company's position concerning locating turbines 1000 feet from a non-participating owner's property line? Can turbines potentially be moved to accommodate this?
