NOTICE OF FILINGS AND PUBLIC HEARING

December 16, 2015

A public hearing on the applications in Case No. PU-15-733 is scheduled for **February 9, 2015, at 1:30 p.m. Central Time, at Teddy's Residential Suites, 113 9th Avenue SE, Watford City, ND 58854.**

Oasis Midstream Services, LLC (Oasis) has filed applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit for a 10.75-inch outside diameter crude oil mainline and one lateral pipeline totaling approximately 19 miles in length. Oasis also proposes to build three aboveground storage tanks at the Wild Basin Gas Processing and Crude Handling Facility (Wild Basin) providing for 200,000 barrels of storage capacity. The pipeline is located in McKenzie County, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map. The mainline will originate at Wild Basin and extend southeast to terminate at the Tesoro Johnsons Corner Station which is located approximately 2.8 miles east of Johnsons Corner, North Dakota. The lateral would transport crude from the mainline to the proposed Dakota Access Pipeline.

Oasis has also filed an application for waivers of procedures and time schedules established under North Dakota Century Code sections 49-22-08, 49-22-08.1, 49-22-13, and North Dakota Administrative Code section 69-06-01-02, requiring separate filings, separate notices, separate hearings and certain time schedules on the certificate of corridor compatibility and route permit applications.

On December 16, 2015, the Commission deemed complete the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and for a route permit.

The issues to be considered in the application for waiver of procedures and time schedules are:


1. Are the proposed facilities of such length, design, location, or purpose that they will produce minimal adverse effects and that adherence to applicable procedures and time schedules may be waived?
2. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

The issues to be considered in the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?


