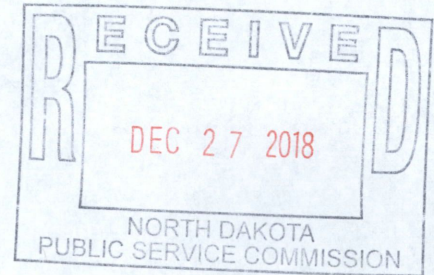

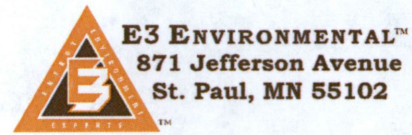

INTRODUCTION

E3 Environmental, LLC (E3) on behalf of Oasis Midstream Services LLC (Oasis) submitted a Tree and Shrub Mitigation Plan (Docket No. 72 to the North Dakota Public Service Commission (PSC) for the Wild Basin to Johnsons Corner Pipeline Project (Project, PU-15-733) on July 28, 2017. The PSC requested additional information via email on August 8, 2017 and a response was filed with the PSC on August 18, 2017 (Docket No. 75.). The PSC reviewed and approved Oasis' Tree and Shrub Mitigation Plan on September 6, 2017 (Docket No. 76.). In accordance with the approved Tree and Shrub Mitigation Plan, Oasis has coordinated with the McKenzie County Soil Conservation District to plant and monitor the survival of trees and shrubs throughout 2018. This report documents the efforts completed on behalf of Oasis as well as identifies the planned tree and shrub mitigation efforts for 2018.

2018 PLANTINGS AND SURVIVAL

As reported in the approved Tree and Shrub Mitigation Plan, a total of 1,192 trees or shrubs were removed during the construction of the Project. Per the PSC's Tree and Shrub Mitigation Specifications, a minimum of 2,384 replacement plantings are required.

In the Spring of 2018 the McKenzie County Soil Conservation District completed 721 plantings for the Project. When the fall survival inventory was completed, it was documented that 459 of the plantings had survived. The combined effects of inclement weather and landowner restrictions significantly impacted replanting efforts resulting in the limited number of plantings in the 2018 growing season.

2019 MITIGATION PLAN

Oasis will continue to utilize the McKenzie County Soil Conservation District to facilitate landowner coordination, site preparation and replacement plantings. In 2019, Oasis intends to complete the replanting of 1,663 tree/shrubs as well as the planting of 262 tree/shrubs to replace those that did not survive 2018.

Currently, some of the affected landowners have refused the replacement plantings, the refused plantings are being placed in a Project Tree Bank. Oasis plans to offer the trees in the Project Tree Bank to landowners that are crossed by the Project but did not have trees/shrubs removed. If inventory remains in the Project Tree Bank after this process Oasis would coordinate with the PSC and McKenzie County to identify acceptable locations for the balance of remaining trees/shrubs.
