Oasis Midstream Services LLC (Oasis or Company) confirms receipt of your letter dated December 28, 2021. In your correspondence to Oasis, you have cited a Reclamation and Revegetation Report (<https://psc.nd.gov/database/documents/15-0733/78-010.pdf>) (Report) prepared by your third-party inspector dated December 29, 2017. You have noted that the report identified various locations that were found, at the time of the inspection, to require additional reclamation and/or revegetation. Oasis understands that you are seeking an accounting of actions taken by the Company to resolve the reported reclamation and revegetation issues.

Actions Taken:

Oasis conducted a file review and interviewed project personnel seeking documentation or recollection of reclamation efforts completed in response to items delineated in the Report. These efforts proved inconclusive.

In the absence of conclusive documentation, Oasis formed a team and developed the following Action Plan:

- Inspect Right of Way:
 - Review each site identified in the report.
- Reclamation and Revegetation:
 - Locations found to have reclamation or revegetation issues would be restored as necessary to reach uniform vegetative cover; and
 - Monitor restoration efforts throughout the growing season.
- Record and Document:
 - Retain appropriate documentation of successful reclamation efforts.

Please note that the execution of the Action Plan is seasonally dependent and as such can not be initiated until conditions are conducive. Further, the Action Plan will require the entire growing season to execute if there are reclamation or revegetation issues identified by our inspection. We anticipate the right of way inspection would occur no earlier than mid-April to be promptly followed by reclamation and revegetation where necessary. If restoration takes place, it will be monitored through the end of the growing season or until vegetation is successfully established. The compilation of associated records and documents would be completed approximately 30 days after the final inspection.
