Pursuant to your request dated December 11, 2019, and in response to the Commission's discussion at the January 2, 2020 work session, Brady Wind II, LLC ("Brady Wind II") provides the following status update regarding installation of the Aircraft Detection Lighting System ("ADLS") at the Brady II Wind Energy Center located in Hettinger and Stark Counties, North Dakota.

As reported in the update provided January 2, 2020, Brady Wind II's ADLS was installed and functional as of December 31, 2019. As a conservative measure, the ADLS was not activated so that Brady Wind II could perform one additional round of test flights and fine-tuning of its software to confirm the safe operation of the system before placing it into service. Brady Wind II completed these final test flights and fine-tuning on the evening of January 2, 2020 and activated the ADLS following these flights. Thus, as of January 2, the ADLS is operating and controlling the turbine lights at the Wind Energy Center.

Brady Wind II and its parent company, NextEra Energy Resources, LLC ("NextEra Energy Resources"), take compliance very seriously and support the Commission's and the State of North Dakota's efforts to require wind generators to implement this new technology at wind generation resources in the state. Brady Wind II is preparing and will provide the Commission

with additional, detailed information regarding the timeline and challenges faced in installation of the ADLS, as well as lessons learned that may be applied to improve the installation of light-mitigating technology at future sites.
