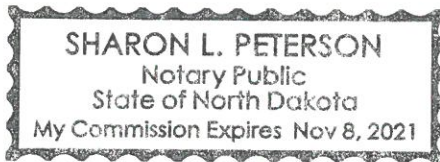

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS DUNN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS JULY 15TH, 2020

MEMBERS PRESENT: Commissioners Pelton, Dukart, Kleemann, Marsh and Hauck

OTHERS PRESENT: Tracey Dolezal, Jeremy Wood, Leisa Moore, Carl Rohde, Jill Denning Gackle, Gary Kuhn, David Lym, and Willard Tormaschy.

Chairman Pelton called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Motion by Kleemann, seconded by Dukart, to approve the agenda. All voted aye, motion carried.

Motion by Dukart, seconded by Marsh to approve the July 1st minutes. All voted aye, motion carried.

Carl Rohde, Civil Science Engineers appeared to report on 9th St/92nd Ave SW and 16th/80th Ave SW projects. Tentative bid date of August 19th for the

16th St SW project.

Darin Schaeffer, Bartlett & West appeared to report on the projects his firm is working on.

Jeremy Wood, Northern Plains Engineering appeared to report on the projects his firm is working on.

24th/119th Ave SW: Baranko Brothers, Inc. final pay estimate # 3 for \$37,822.53 was presented for payment. Motion by Dukart, seconded by Hauck, to approve. All voted aye, motion carried.

30th St SW: Construction is complete, except for signing and general clean up.

101st Ave: Dunn Center to 11th St SW: Bid opening set for August 5th @ 10 a.m.

Project will start about 1000' south of Highway 200.

101st Ave SW (23rd - 30th): Tentative bid date of August 19th

Gap Road South: Anticipate August or September bid date

Discussed the road constructed for access into the Lee Pavlicek pit. Engineer Wood noted that the section line was staked, but marked 33 feet off the section line; however, the contractor assumed the stakes marked the centerline of the section line when the road was built.

Superintendent Lym appeared and presented the 2021 road department budget. Without projected

road projects the budget reflects an approximate 5% cut. Discussed priorities on 2020 and 2021 road projects.

Kelly Summerfield, Killdeer City Commission appeared to discuss the Killdeer landfill and asked the Commission if the county would be interested in a countywide inert landfill. The lease on the current city landfill is expiring at the end of this year and not available for the future.

The consensus of the Commission is to work with the City of Killdeer and explore options for a countywide landfill. Commissioner Kleemann will work with the city and look into land availability.

Carie Boster, JDA Director appeared to report on the 2021 JDA budget that was approved by the JDA Board of Directors.

Discussed the County Housing Task Force's three different housing assistance plans for 2021 and a request for capitalized funds of between \$500,000 - \$1,000,000.

If approved, the JDA would administer the funds for the following housing programs:

Housing down payment assistance program for new construction homes. (This is currently done in McKenzie County).

Buy down of interest as new homes are built and moved into, this program would buy down

interest on the older homes, which will allow people to afford the older starter homes.

County housing task force to ready lots in communities by funding the removal of old houses.

Motion by Hauck, seconded by Dukart to allocate \$750,000 for the JDA Housing program in the 2021 budget with federal mineral royalty funds to be deposited in a separate JDA account. Upon roll call vote, all voted aye, motion carried.

Leisa Moore, paralegal for States Attorney office appeared to present the department's 2021 budget.

Sheriff Kuhn, appeared to present the 2021 Sheriff department's budget. Sheriff Kuhn noted it is a challenging year for law enforcement with police reform. The proposed budget stayed the same as the 2020 budget.

Greg Benz, ANR Extension Agent appeared to present the 2021 Extension budget and to report on the activities of the Extension Office.

Motion by Kleemann, seconded by Hauck, to approve the Special Events permit for the Wolff's Den for the Dodge Rodeo on July 18-19 in Dodge. All voted aye, motion carried.

Motion by Dukart, seconded by Marsh, to approve a resolution to support the DOJ motion on behalf of the Corps of Engineers to issue a stay of the order to shut down the DAPL pipeline.

At 12:00 noon, the meeting recessed for lunch and reconvened at 1:00 p.m. with all members present.

Code Administrator Sandy Rohde appeared and presented the following CUP that was recommended for approval by the Planning & Zoning Board at the July 14th hearing:

Michael Wormley, of Dickinson, ND representing Martin Construction filed a CUP for a 13 acre gravel pit located in the S2SE4SW4 of Section 2-143-96. The property is zoned Rural Preservation and is owned by the Helen J. Brew Living Trust.

Motion by Hauck, seconded by Kleemann, to approve. Upon roll call vote, Commissioners Hauck, Kleemann, Dukart and Pelton voted "aye". Commissioner Marsh abstained. The motion carried.

Administrator Rohde presented the 2021 Planning and 911 budgets. Discussed legal counsel for Planning & Zoning and asked that Rohde look at an estimate of hours that legal counsel was needed this past year.

Nicole Carlson, Tax Director appeared to present the 2021 Tax Director budget.

Carlson presented Kompleks' contract for Industrial assessments. Motion by Hauck, seconded by Dukart, to approve the two year contract. All voted aye, motion carried.

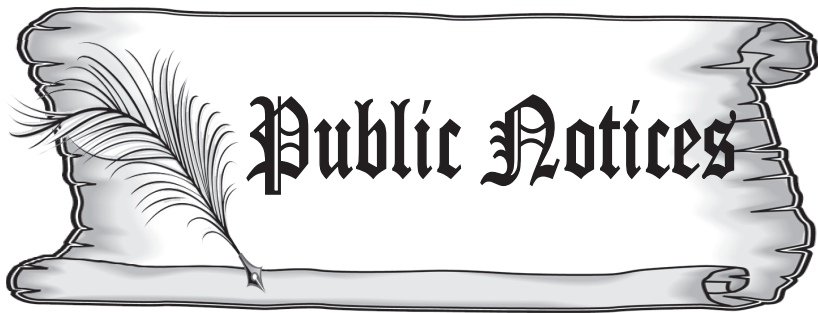

(WBI Energy) filed an Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (Application) with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in Docket No. CP20-52-000. The application requests authority to construct, modify, operate, and maintain natural gas transmission facilities in Williams, McKenzie, Mountrail, and Burke Counties, North Dakota. This work is collectively known as the North Bakken Expansion Project (Project). On July 28, 2020, WBI Energy submitted an Amendment to the Application in Docket No. CP20-52-001.

WBI Energy is a natural gas company engaged in the transportation and storage of natural gas in Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming. WBI Energy also operates underground storage reservoirs in the Baker Field, Montana; the Elk Basin Field, Wyoming; and the Billy Creek Field, Wyoming to serve its natural gas system.

The changes to the Project WBI Energy is proposing in the Amendment include: (i) reducing the Project's incremental firm transportation design capacity from 350,000 mcf per day to 250,000 mcf per day by reducing the number of additional compressor units at its existing Tioga Compressor Station located in Williams County from six units to three units; (ii) updating Project costs to reflect the reduction in additional compressor units at the Tioga Compressor Station, as well as a reduction in estimated Project costs related to the purchase of pipeline, construction of the proposed Elkhorn Creek Compressor Station, and the construction of WBI Energy's interconnect facilities with Northern Border Pipeline Company, and (iii) updating certain appurtenant Project facilities.

The Project, as amended, will continue to provide incremental firm transportation capacity from natural gas processing plants to a proposed interconnect with Northern Border Pipeline Company. The reduction in the Project's design capacity to 250,000 mcf per day is in response to current market conditions impacting oil and natural gas production. The Project, however, continues to be supported by binding, long-term firm transportation commitments for a total of 243,000 equivalent dekatherms per day. The need for new pipeline infrastructure in the Williston Basin of north-west North Dakota continues to be of critical importance to allow for the transportation of increasing levels of associated natural gas production and to aid in the reduction of natural gas flaring. If approved, WBI Energy plans to begin construction in the spring 2021 and have the new facilities in service by November 1, 2021.
