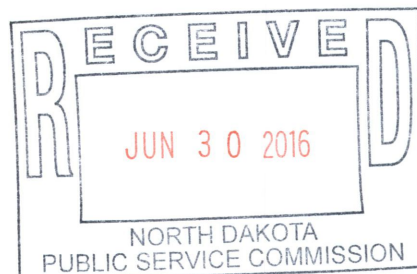

MANAGEMENT SUMMARY

Oliver Wind III, LLC (Oliver III), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of NextEra Energy Resources, LLC, (NEER) proposes to construct the Oliver III Transmission Line (Project). The Project consists of approximately 4.5 miles (mi) (7.2 kilometers [km]) of new 230-kilovolt (kV) overhead transmission line on leased private property in Oliver and Morton Counties, North Dakota. Tetra Tech, on the behalf of NEER, submitted an initial Class III Cultural Resource Inventory in April 2016 for the proposed transmission line route and switchyard (Holven et al. 2016). This investigation received State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND) concurrence in May 2016 (NDSHPO REF.: 16-04485B).

This addendum investigation presents the results of the pedestrian survey of previously unsurveyed areas including minor shifts to the construction easement along the transmission line route (0.4 acres [ac] [0.2 hectares {ha}]), additional areas for the switchyard (1.9 ac [0.8 ha]), the addition of a transmission line cable pulling location (3.6 ac [1.5 ha]), and additional areas for the guy-wire anchors (0.05 ac [0.02 ha]). These areas comprise the Addendum Survey Corridor, which includes 6.3 ac (2.6 ha).

No cultural resources were documented during the pedestrian survey of the Addendum Survey Corridor. Additionally, shovel probing was not deemed necessary within portions of the Addendum Survey Corridor. Tetra Tech recommends, per NDCC 49-22-09(9), that no archaeological sites will be affected by the Project.

If areas beyond the Survey Corridor are to be used during construction, then Tetra Tech recommends that an addendum Class III Cultural Resource Inventory be conducted to determine the presence or absence of archaeological sites within these areas.
