

Dear Mr. Fahn:

By letter dated January 13, 2022, the North Dakota Public Service Commission (“Commission”) alleged that Plains Terminals North Dakota LLC (“Plains”) was in non-compliance with the August 17, 2016 order of the Commission in Case No. PU-16-140 (the “Notice”). Specifically, the Notice alleges that Plains has not filed the as-built mapping documents for the above-referenced project. Plains requested, and the Commission granted, an extension until February 23, 2022 for Plains to respond to the Notice. Upon further investigation and review of the public documents available on the Commission’s website (<https://www.psc.nd.gov/>), Plains changed its name to Eighty-Eight Terminals North Dakota LLC (“Eight-Eight”) and the Commission issued First Reissued Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 191 and First Reissued Route Permit No. 203 to Eight-Eight. *See* Case No. PU-20-405. The name change occurred in connection with the acquisition by Eighty-Eight Oil LLC of all of the interests in Plains previously owned by Plains Marketing, L.P. Accordingly, the Notice should be directed to Eight-Eight Terminals North Dakota LLC for further action.
