

DAKOTA VALLEY ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE

RATE SCHEDULE

**THREE-PHASE LARGE COMMERCIAL
SERVICE**

RC: 56, 356

Applicability

This rate is applicable for three-phase loads with peak kW demand between 151-kW and 2000-kW, and meeting all other Cooperative requirements and policies.

Type of Service

60 hertz service. V-phase service at available primary and secondary voltages. Three-phase service at primary voltages or secondary voltages of 480/277 or 208/120.

Monthly Rate

Basic Service Charge	\$77.00 per month
Demand Charge	\$12.00 per kW
Energy Charge:	
First 150 kWh/kW	\$ 0.0620 per kWh
Next 150 kWh/kW	\$ 0.0587 per kWh
Excess Energy	\$ 0.0510 per kWh
Transformer Capacity Charge	\$1.00 charge for each additional kVA over 30 less demand and energy usage for the month.
On-Site Facility Charges	Calculated based on the cost of on-site facilities multiplied by a factor of 0.0078

Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge under this rate consists of the Basic Service Charge plus the Transformer Capacity Charge and any On-Site Facility Charges.

Power Factor Adjustment

The Member agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. The Cooperative reserves the right to adjust the Billing Demand when the average monthly power factor drops below 95 percent. Such adjustments shall be made by increasing the measured demand 1 percent for each 1 percent by which the average power factor is less than 95 percent lagging.

Taxes and City Franchise Fees

The rates set forth in this schedule are based on taxes as of the last adoption or amendment date. Any increase in existing or new taxes on the transmission, distribution, or sales of electricity allocable to sales hereunder shall be added to this rate.

Any franchise fees imposed on the cooperative shall be allocated to accounts within the specific franchise area as an additional charge.

Delivery Point

The delivery point shall be as specified in the Agreement for Electric Service.

Line Extension

Line extension charges shall be determined and assessed in accordance with Cooperative line extension policies.

Member Responsibilities

It shall be the Member's responsibility to provide the Cooperative an electric wiring certificate before service is to be connected, and the Cooperative reserves the right to routinely inspect the installation.

It shall be the Member's responsibility to provide protection from unauthorized access to the breaker box, disconnect facilities or other electrical equipment at this installation. It shall also be the Member's responsibility to provide fuses or thermal protection for Member's equipment and to maintain electrical equipment in accordance with existing safety codes.

Terms of Payment

Billing procedures and terms of payment shall be in accordance with Cooperative billing policies and procedures.
