NOTICE OF FILINGS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

May 10, 2017

Public hearings on the applications for Case No. PU-17-97 are scheduled for **July 24, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. Central Time, at the Sleep Inn, 2400 10th Street SW, Minot, North Dakota 58701** and **July 25, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. Central Time, at Tioga City Hall, 16 1st Street NE Tioga, North Dakota 58852.**

Cenex Pipeline, LLC (Cenex) has filed applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit concerning the location for approximately 149.7 miles of 10-inch diameter refined petroleum products pipeline and associated facilities in Williams, Mountrail, and Ward Counties, North Dakota, as shown on the attached map.

Cenex has also filed an application for waivers of procedures and time schedules established under North Dakota Century Code sections 49-22-07.2, 49-22-08, 49-22-08.1, 49-22-13, and North Dakota Administrative Code section 69-06-01-02 and chapter 69-06-06, requiring separate filings, separate notices, separate hearings and separate orders on such applications.

The issues in the application for waiver of procedures and time schedules are:

1. Are the proposed facilities of such length, design, location, or purpose that they will produce minimal adverse effects and that adherence to applicable procedures and time schedules may be waived?
2. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

The issues in the applications for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will the proposed facility locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?


If determined that a waiver of procedures and time schedules is appropriate, the Commission may consider the application for a corridor certificate and route permit without further notice.
