Dear Mr. Nitschke:

Please find enclosed the original and ten copies of the Application for Certificate of Site Compatibility for the Wild Basin Gas Plant Expansion Project, along with a CD containing an electronic copy of the application and a copy of the Affidavit of Service by Mail. Also enclosed is a check in the amount of \$62,500 for the filing fee.

Oasis Midstream Services, LLC (“OMS”) currently operates the Wild Basin Gas Plant in McKenzie County, which is a gas plant capable of processing 80,000 mcf of gas per day. Due to anticipated development in Oasis Petroleum North America, LLC’s (“OPNA”) core production area, which is known as the “Wild Basin,” OMS anticipates that the need for gas processing in the area will be substantially increased and OMS is seeking approval to expand the capacity of the Plant by 265,000 mcf to a total capacity of 345,000 mcf.

At the same time, OMS intends to increase the capacity of a crude oil stabilization facility it operates at the Wild Basin Gas Plant from 50,000 barrels of crude oil per day to 80,000 barrels of crude oil per day. “Stabilization” is a process to remove lighter gases from the crude oil to lower the vapor pressure of the crude oil to meet regulatory requirements and contract specifications. While OMS does not believe that “stabilization” constitutes the “manufacture or refinement ...of liquid hydrocarbon products” in accordance with Section 49-22-03(5)(e), to the extent the Commission disagrees, OMS is requesting that the crude stabilization facility be included in the siting certification.

OMS anticipates that it will take approximately fifteen months to construct the plant expansion. To minimize gas flaring and avoid winter construction, Oasis needs to begin construction activities by mid-August, 2017. Accordingly OMS respectfully requests that an order be issued in this matter by August 1, 2017.
