

7. The Project will originate west of 147th Ave. NW, McKenzie County and west of the existing Spring Creek Pump Station which was approved in Case No. PU-15-725 at milepost 10.1 (Figure page 1). A block valve, launcher, and isolation valve are proposed to be constructed at milepost 10.1.
8. The Project route will continue west terminating east of 150th Ave. NW, McKenzie County, North Dakota. ONEOK proposes to construct a block valve, isolation valve, and a receiver at the terminus of the pipeline for a tie-in to the existing Garden Creek 10-inch pipeline (Figure page 6).
9. ONEOK intends to begin construction on the Project in May 2017, and anticipates the in-service date will be in late June 2017. Right-of-way restoration will continue through the summer and fall until permanently stabilized.
10. In accordance with N.D.C.C. § 49-22-3(3)(a), ONEOK certifies as follows:
 - a. The Project is for construction of the same type of facility as the Original Facility.
 - b. The Project's construction activities will be conducted wholly within the geographic location for which ONEOK previously obtained a corridor certificate as designated in the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order issued in Case No. PU-11-66.
 - i. The Project's geographic location is also wholly within the corridor certificate, as designated in the Commission's August 17, 2016 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order in Case No. PU-15-694, issued for ONEOK's proposed 16-inch Garden Creek Loop NGL transmission pipeline.
 - ii. A portion of the Project's geographic location is within the corridor certificate, as designated in the Commission's February 10, 2016 Order Amending Certificate and Permit in Case No. PU-15-725, issued for ONEOK's existing Spring Creek Pump Station.
 - c. The Project's construction activities are for a new NGL transmission facility and will increase the capacity of the existing NGL transmission facility.
 - d. An environmental analysis, conducted for ONEOK in 2011, and subsequently in 2015 (conducted in relation to PU-15-694), evaluated the Project's impact relative to the Exclusion and Avoidance Areas set forth in N.D. Admin. Code § 69-06-08-02.
 - e. The Project as routed will not affect any known Exclusion or Avoidance Areas.
11. ONEOK will continue to comply with the December 2, 2011 order in Case No. PU-11-66 designating the corridor, and will continue to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and rules.
12. ONEOK respectfully requests the Commission's written acknowledgement of receipt of this Certification.
