**CERTIFICATION OF APPLICANT PURSUANT TO NORTH
DAKOTA CENTURY CODE § 49-22.1-15 AND
NOTIFICATION OF MODIFICATION**

Curt Van Hoorn, being first duly sworn upon oath, states and alleges as follows:

1. I am the Vice President of Operations for Arrow Field Services, LLC (“Arrow”) with authority to provide information on behalf of Arrow. In this position, I am familiar with the above-captioned matter and have the authority to bind Arrow with respect to the certification made herein.

2. In an order dated June 30, 2017 in the above-captioned matter, the Public Service Commission (“Commission”) approved Certificate of Corridor Compatibility No. 199 for the designated corridor (“Corridor”) and Route Permit No. 210 designating the route (“Route”) for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the project, which includes an 8-inch NGL pipeline and a 10-inch residue gas pipeline (“Project”). The Certification Relating to Order Provisions – Transmission Facility Siting (“Order Certification”) executed by Arrow was incorporated by reference and attached to the order issued by the Commission.

3. I submit this certification in accordance with North Dakota Century Code (“N.D.C.C.”) § 49-22.1-15(3) and Paragraph 32 of the Order Certification in support of Arrow’s route adjustments and modification to the Project.

4. Arrow explored potential third party pipeline and facility interconnection opportunities throughout Project development, and had determined the preferred interconnection option at the time of permitting. However, it has been determined that the third party interconnection locations must be modified to interconnect the Project with a Northern Border facility and a ONEOK facility.

5. As noted, Arrow now seeks to modify the approved Project Route under N.D.C.C. § 49-22.1-15(3) to interconnect the Project with the third party facilities. A 0.20-mile-long route adjustment is required for the 8-inch NGL pipeline and a 0.20-mile-long route adjustment is required for the 10-inch residue gas pipeline. A map depicting the Project's designated Corridor and designated Route, and the Project's route adjustments and associated corridor adjustment for the pipelines is attached as **Exhibit A**.

6. Arrow also provides notification pursuant to Order Certification Provision 32 of Arrow's Project modification to include a meter station interconnect to be located entirely within the Project's Designated Corridor. A map depicting the meter station interconnect is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

7. The Project modification inside the Corridor is covered by the previous studies conducted for the Project included in the original siting application. *See* Consolidated Application for Certificate of Corridor Compatibility and Route Permit, PSC Docket No. 1.

8. The length of the route adjustments under N.D.C.C. § 49-22.1-15(3) extending outside of the Corridor are less than one and one-half miles in length. As noted above, a 0.20-mile-long route adjustment is required for the 8-inch NGL pipeline and a 0.20-mile-long route adjustment is required for the 10-inch residue gas pipeline.

9. Appropriate landowner coordination has occurred. Arrow is a wholly owned subsidiary of Crestwood Equity Partners, LP (“Crestwood”), and Crestwood is the owner of the property on which the pipeline route adjustment and associated corridor adjustment for the third party interconnects is located. Accordingly, no owner of real property on which an adjustment is to be located and no applicable governmental entity with an interest in the same adjustment area oppose the adjustment.

10. Supplemental surveys were conducted by SWCA Environmental Consultants (“SWCA”) for the route adjustments with respect to Natural Resources and Cultural Resources.

11. On August 9 and 22, 2017, SWCA completed a natural resources survey of the proposed pipeline route adjustment located in the SW¼ of Section 29, Township 149 North, Range 98 West, McKenzie County, North Dakota. No wetlands, woody vegetation, noxious weeds, or threatened or endangered species or habitat were observed within the area surveyed. A copy of the Addendum to the Natural Resources Report for the Arrow NB Residue Gas Pipeline and Arrow Bakken NGL Pipeline Project in McKenzie County, North Dakota prepared by SWCA is attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.

12. On August 22, 2017, SWCA completed a cultural resources survey for the route adjustment required for the third party interconnects. The results of the survey applicable to the pipeline route and corridor adjustment for the interconnects are provided in the August 23, 2017 Addendum 2 to a Class I and Class III Cultural Resources Inventory (“Addendum 2”), attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.

13. The Addendum 2 was submitted to the SHPO for review. The SHPO found the Addendum 2 acceptable and determined there has been a good faith effort to identify and avoid

impacts to Significant Sites provided the Project remains as mapped and described. A copy of the SHPO letter applicable to the route adjustments is attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.

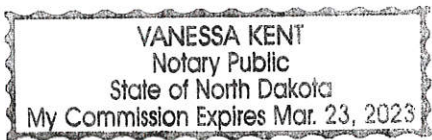
14. Construction activities for the route adjustments outside the designated Corridor will not affect any known exclusion or avoidance areas. *See* Exhibits A, C, D, and E.

15. Arrow will comply with the Commission's orders, laws and rules designating the corridor and designating the route.
