



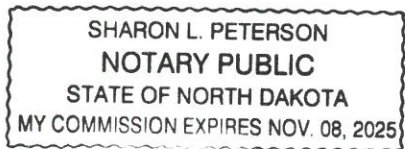

The Commission’s June 13, 2018, Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order (Order) in Case No. PU-18-72 issued Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Nos. 205, 206 and 207, and Route Permit Nos. 215, 216, and 217 to Andeavor Field Services LLC (Andeavor) for the location of a natural gas liquids pipeline approximately 17-miles long in McKenzie County; for a natural gas liquids pipeline approximately 22-miles long in Billings and Stark Counties, and for four liquids product pipelines, each approximately 5 miles long, in Stark and Billings Counties, North Dakota (the Project).

On November 19, 2021, Andeavor filed with the Commission a consolidated combined application requesting that the Commission amend its June 13, 2018, Order and issue amended Certificate of Corridor Compatibility Nos. 205, 206 and 207, and Route Permit Nos. 215, 216, and 217 to Andeavor designating the corridors and routes for the Project to match the corridors and routes for the Project as it was physically constructed.

Andeavor also requests a waiver of the hearing requirement and proceed by virtue of the Commission’s notice of opportunity for hearing procedure.

The issues in the application for waiver of procedures and time schedules are:

1. Are the proposed facilities of such length, design, location, or purpose that they will produce minimal adverse effects and that adherence to applicable procedures and time schedules may be waived?

2. Is it appropriate for the Commission to waive any procedures and time schedules as requested in the application?

The issues in the consolidated combined application for amended

certificates of corridor compatibility and amended route permits are:

1. Will the location and operation of the proposed facilities produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?

2. Are the proposed facilities compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?

3. Will the proposed facility’s locations minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?

Those interested are invited to comment on the application in writing. Persons desiring a hearing must file a written request identifying their interest in the proceeding and the reasons for requesting a hearing. Comments and requests for hearing must be received by January 6, 2022. If deemed appropriate, the Commission can determine the matter without a hearing.

wouldn’t take it over.

“The NDDOT does not currently have the authorization, or the legislative authority needed to take the lead on the project as described in the (commission’s November) letter,” said Panos.

In other words, he meant that the state Legislature would have to pass a law to allow the NDDOT to lead the project.

Kasian said that other than using eminent domain, he was uncomfortable with the project because the county would have to borrow money for it. However, he said he would still like to see a bridge built and that a willing landowner would be needed.

The bridge would create a new connection between Billings and Golden Valley coun-

ties. An environmental impact study paid for by Billings County determined the best location of the bridge and connecting roads, which would involve using state, U.S. Forest Service and about 66 acres of land owned by the Short family. The Short family refused to sell the land, and so the county would need to acquire it through a court order.

According to some of the discussion, there are hopes that an alternative site for the bridge can be found – a site in which a landowner is willing to sell.

However, County Auditor Marcia Lamb, who noted that she has seen the planning process over the past several years, said it would be likely that another study would determine that the best location for the

bridge was on the Short land. Later in the meeting, Lamb also said the county does have the money for the bridge. She said the county has \$32 million for such projects, and has \$12 million marked for the bridge.

Rodne – as he did at the previous meeting - raised the idea of putting the bridge to a county-wide election.

“This is a major, major decision,” said Rodne.

Commissioners moved on to other scheduled meeting business by about 11 a.m., Tuesday. Whether the project again became a topic of discussion that day wasn’t known to the Billings County Pioneer after that time because its reporter had left due to deadlines.

Discovery of Chateau wine bottles recounted

Every summer, the small town of Medora is flooded with tourists, but the town shouldn’t be remembered without first remembering those who worked to make it North Dakota’s most popular historic destination.

Medora’s legacy as a tourist town began as early as 1936 when Louis Vallombrosa, the Marquis de Mores’ eldest son donated the de Mores properties to the State of North Dakota. The State Historical Society of North Dakota was made the trustee of the property and began work on the plans for renovation. Early steps of the renovation began as early as May, 1939, and on Nov. 30 of that year, the Badlander reported an interesting event.

The Works Progress Administration (WPA) and the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) were conducting much of the renovation. Crews were excavating the basement of the chateau when one of the enrollees discovered several bottles of

rare wine that was bottled in Bordeaux, France in the early 1800s. The discovery generated much excitement around the chateau. Rumors spread that the supervisors took the wine home and drank it, but Marge Neuens Gratton, originally of Medora, said this wasn’t so. Her husband, Weldon Gratton was one of the landscape architects working on the project and was present when the wine was discovered. He told Marge about the incident.

She said: “They were grading there, and they didn’t have large equipment like they have today. They were grading and part of the tractor kind of fell into what became the wine cellar. There are lots of stories that tell about that, but there wasn’t really any wine left in those containers. The wine was pretty well dried out so no one got drunk on it. I just heard a story ... that the boys didn’t get any of the wine but the supervisors and whatnot got it and took it home, but that isn’t true. There wasn’t any wine to take home, but

it makes a good story for the boys.”

Instead, she said, the bottles were probably given to the State Historical Society. Perhaps the de Mores were known for entertaining guests, but the boys of the WPA and CCC did not join in that tradition!

Work continued on the project and today the Chateau has had millions of visitors and is the most visited site in the state. The Chateau was just one project of the WPA and CCC, however. The CCC also helped build roads, fight fires, and plant trees across the nation, and in North Dakota, they also built wildlife refuges.

The CCC was brought together by President Franklin Roosevelt during the Depression to “[bring together] two wasted resources, the young men and the land, in an effort to save both,” according to cccalumni.org. Apparently the plan also worked to save some of North Dakota’s important historical property. It is a pity, however, that it was too late for the wine!

Thomas Young Bird Jr., "Magi guwa" (Soldier), was born June 10, 1941, in Crow Agency, Montana to Lottie Sherwood and Thomas Young Bird, Sr. Thomas Jr. was the firstborn to this union, and one of nine brothers with two sisters. His mother Lottie named all her children after Saints from the bible. Thomas grew up in Crow Agency, MT, and Lodge Grass, MT in the early part of his childhood where his dad operated a cattle ranch. The boys all loved to hunt with their dad and Uncle Frank Sherwood. Thomas attended the Lodge Grass elementary school with his brothers until they returned to Mandaree in 1955.

Thomas was drafted into the US Army in 1964 and was sent overseas to Vietnam in 1965. Saigon, Vietnam was his assigned duty station. Thomas served a year in the Transportation Division under General Westmoreland, who oversaw all the operations in Vietnam. would mean the court was abdicating its judicial power, the authority conferred by Article 3 of the Constitution, to decide cases and controversies brought before it.

A second option, that of ordering the president to deliver the commission, seemed equally unappealing, since the court lacked authority to enforce its ruling. Would Jefferson refuse to obey the court's ruling? While the principle of executive accountability to the law has since been well established, it had yet to be litigated, and Marshall may have feared a setback for the judiciary, the weakest of the three branches of the government, if Jefferson ignored such a ruling.

In what scholars have termed a masterstroke in judicial statesmanship, Chief Justice Marshall avoided both courses, including a collision with the president. Marshall, for the court, held that section 13 of the Judiciary Act was unconstitutional since the original jurisdiction conferred upon the court by the Article 3, could be exercised only in cases involving ambassadors, public ministers and cases involving states. The court, he declared, might issue a mandamus, but only in cases involving its appellate jurisdiction. Congress has no authority to enlarge the court's original jurisdiction, which was granted by the Constitution, just as it lacks

authority to change any provisions in the Constitution, except by initiating the amendatory process.

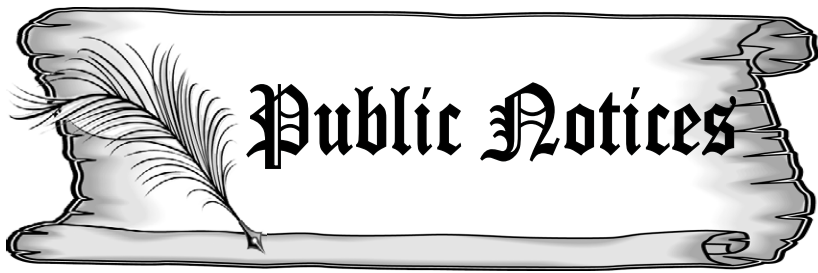
When the court announced that section 13 was unconstitutional, on grounds that it was in conflict with Article 3 of the Constitution, it was exercising the power of judicial review for the first time in our nation's history. Marshall wrote: "It is emphatically the province and duty of the judicial department to say what the law is." In a case involving a conflict of laws -- in *Marbury v. Madison* a statute and a constitutional provision -- it is the essence of judicial duty to "say what the law is." Given the supremacy of the Constitution, a statute in conflict with its terms is unconstitutional.

The source of the judiciary's authority to exercise the power of judicial review, unmentioned in the Constitution, has been a source of concern for many citizens. We turn to that question next week.
