Dear Mr. Hanson:

Powers Lake Elevator Company ("Powers Lake") hereby makes demand that you and your company immediately pay to Powers Lake any and all indebtedness currently owing with respect to those certain grain contracts entered into by and between your company and Powers Lake.

As more fully detailed below, as of today's date, the above-referenced indebtedness totals \$505,450.81 and consists of (a) the unpaid purchase price owing under those grain contracts in which some or all of the specified quantity of grain has been delivered; and (b) those amounts necessary to "close out" those open grain contracts upon which your company has failed to take delivery. In addition to these amounts, we also make demand of payment relating to any protein premium amounts that would be due to Powers Lake based upon the final settlement of any northern spring wheat that has shipped.


