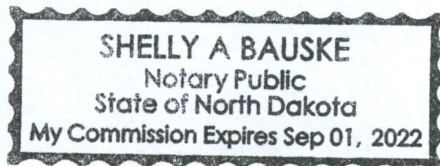

NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

February 28, 2019

A public hearing on the application in Case No. PU-18-399 is scheduled for **April 3, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. Central Time at Teddy's Residential Suites, 113 9th Avenue SE, Watford City, ND 58854**

ONEOK Bakken Pipeline, L.L.C. filed a combined application for a corridor certificate and route permit for the location of a natural gas liquids pipeline, approximately 77-miles long with approximately 74 miles located in North Dakota in McKenzie County. The pipeline location is shown on the attached map.

The issues in the combined application for a certificate of corridor compatibility and a route permit are:

1. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location produce minimal adverse effects on the environment and upon the welfare of the citizens of North Dakota?
2. Is the proposed facility compatible with the environmental preservation and the efficient use of resources?
3. Will construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility at the proposed location minimize adverse human and environmental impact while ensuring continuing system reliability and integrity and ensuring that energy needs are met and fulfilled in an orderly and timely fashion?
